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I. FINAL ACTION STATUS:

HB 1393 passed the House on March 9, 1999, and passed the Senate on March 16, 1999. The bill was approved by the Governor and became law April 6, 1999 (Chapter 99-127, Laws of Florida).

II. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Child Support Enforcement Application & Program Revenue Trust Fund without modification effective November 4, 2000. The Child Support Enforcement Application & Program Revenue Trust Fund, FLAIR #73-2-104 is administered by the Department of Revenue. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 95-92, Laws of Florida.

III. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 61.1814, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides for its purpose, and provides for its revenues.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The Child Support Enforcement Application & Program Revenue Trust Fund was established to control and account for application fees, user fees, and associated revenues applicable to the Child Support Enforcement Program.

MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

Application fees of nonpublic assistance applicants for child support enforcement services and fines imposed under ss. 409.2564(8) and 409.2578, F.S. According to Comptroller data, receipts to this fund for FY 1997-98 were \$4.7 million.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
