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16	Section 1. Section 381.100, Florida Statutes, is
17	created to read:

25	(1) The Legislature has determined that:
26	(a) The state is committed to the economic,
27	environmental, and public health revitalization of its
28	communities;
29	(b) Measures to address the public health needs of
30	low-income communities that are exposed to contaminated sites
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 must be implemented in order to ensure the sustainability of
these communities;

- (c) The implementation of these measures will enhance cooperative efforts among the private sector, government, and nonprofit organizations in this state to ensure the sustainability of Florida; and
- (d) It would be beneficial to provide resources in this state to undertake a series of pilot projects that demonstrate techniques and approaches to ensure health care for disease prevention and health promotion for low-income persons who are living in communities with environmental contamination.
- (2) Community Environmental Health Program pilot projects are established to promote disease prevention and health among low-income persons living near environmentally contaminated sites.
- (3) The pilot projects shall build upon existing environmental and economic efforts to address contaminated sites through the Brownfields Redevelopment Act, the Eastward Brownfields Showcase Partnership, the federal Superfund program, and other state and federal programs that address public health and the environment.
- (4) The pilot projects may form partnerships with existing health care providers and units, contribute to a health care needs assessment, provide research capacity to improve health status, and serve as the basis for health care capacity in underserved areas with contamination.
  - (5) The following pilot projects are created:
- (a) In Pinellas County through the Greenwood Community

  Health Center in Clearwater, for the low-income communities

designated as a pilot project under the Brownfields
Redevelopment Act.

(b) In Escambia County, for the low-income compared to the compar

- (b) In Escambia County, for the low-income communities designated as a brownfields project within the Palafox Redevelopment Area.
- (c) In Hillsborough, Pinellas, Sarasota, and Manatee

  Counties for the Urban League of Pinellas County, to operate

  its mobile health screening unit to provide public health care

  to persons living in low-income communities with contaminated

  sites within those counties.
- (d) In Palm Beach County, for the low-income communities with contaminated sites within in the City of Riviera Beach.
- (e) Three additional pilot projects shall be created in 2000 by the Community Environmental Health Program to serve low-income communities with designated brownfield sites or federal Superfund sites.
- Section 3. Section 381.103, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 381.103 Community Environmental Health Program; duties of department.--The department shall:
- (1) Assist the pilot projects in development and implementation of their community programs.
- (2) Facilitate the integration of the pilot projects with ongoing departmental programs, so that duplication of services is avoided and synergy between the programs enhanced.

  28 educational and outreach programs for health care providers

(4) Develop the capacity of the pilot projects to 1 2 participate in research endeavors that promote disease prevention and health in low-income communities with 3 4 environmental contamination. 5 (5) Assist the pilot projects in obtaining low-cost 6 health care services designed to prevent disease and promote 7 health in communities with environmental contamination. 8 (6) Prepare a report to be submitted to the President 9 of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, 10 and the Governor on the findings, accomplishments, and 11 recommendations of the Community Environmental Health Program 12 and the pilot projects. 13 (7) Facilitate cooperation between affected 14 communities, appropriate agencies, and ongoing initiatives, 15 such as Front Porch Florida, in order to ensure the health and 16 economic and environmental vitality of communities in this 17 state. Section 4. (1) There is hereby appropriated from the 18 19 General Revenue Fund the sum of \$1.825 million per year for 20 fiscal years 1999-2003 for the Community Environmental Health Program pilot projects. Of this amount, for fiscal year 21 22 1999-2000, \$500,000 each is allocated for the Pinellas County, Escambia County, and Palm Beach County pilot projects; 23 \$125,000 is allocated for the Urban League of Pinellas County; 24 and \$200,000 is allocated to the Community Environmental 25 26 Health Program of the Department of Health, to assist in the 27 implementation of the pilot projects. For each of fiscal years 28 2000-2001, 2001-2002, and 2002-2003, the three additional 29 pilot projects shall be allocated \$300,000 each; the pilot

projects in Pinellas, Escambia, and Palm Beach Counties shall

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be allocated \$200,000 each; the Urban League of Pinellas

1	County shall be allocated \$125,000; and the Department of
2	Health shall be allocated \$200,000.
3	(2) The funds allocated under subsection (1) must be

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## HOUSE SUMMARY

Creates the Florida Environmental Health Protection Act. Establishes Community Environmental Health Program pilot projects to promote disease prevention and health among low-income persons living near environmentally contaminated sites. Designates pilot projects in specified counties, and provides for three additional pilot projects beginning in 2000. Provides duties of the Department of Health to assist the pilot projects and requires a report to the Governor and Legislature. Provides appropriations to implement the pilot projects and program for fiscal years 1999-2003. Specifies use of appropriations.
