(3) The Department of Environmental Protection may grant an exception to subsections (1) or (2) only in the following circumstances: (a) The applicant conclusively demonstrates that no other practical alternative exists, the discharge will receive advanced waste treatment as defined in s. 403.086(4), or a higher level of treatment, and the applicant conclusively demonstrates that the proposed discharge will not result in a violation of water quality standards; or (b) The applicant's discharge is a limited wet weather surface water discharge serving as a backup to a reuse system pursuant to s. 403.086(7)(a) and will not cause a violation of state water quality standards and is subject to the requirements of department rules.
