A bill to be entitled
An act relating to education; providing for a
pilot scholarship program in Dade County;
providing for eligibility and amount of
scholarships; providing program requirements;
requiring annual reports and evaluations;
providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) The Department of Education shall, beginning in the 2000-2001 school year, institute a 3-year pilot scholarship program in Dade County to be administered by the School Board of Dade County, which shall provide annual scholarships for 1 percent of the students for 1 full year of academic instruction at any public or eligible nonpublic school. Students in grades 4 through 9 who qualify for a dropout prevention program pursuant to s. 230.2316, Florida Statutes, and who attend an inner-city school in Dade County are eligible to receive a scholarship to a school of their parents' or guardians' choice. Participation in the program shall be voluntary and shall require parent or guardian involvement.

- (2) The award of scholarships shall be by a lottery of all eligible students, with steps taken to ensure that district racial and ethnic diversity is maintained in the lottery process.
- (3) Students who successfully complete an academic year and progress to the next grade shall be guaranteed continuation in the program.

 

- (4) Those students determined to be eligible shall be notified by April 1 of the school year preceding participation in the program.
- (5) Eligible nonpublic schools shall comply with compulsory attendance laws pursuant to s. 232.01, Florida Statutes; file a database survey form with the Department of Education pursuant to s. 229.808, Florida Statutes; meet all health, safety, and sanitation requirements, pursuant to chapter 381, Florida Statutes; have admission policies which do not discriminate on the basis of race, national origin, sex, or handicap; require criminal background checks of all teachers and administrators; and ensure that disciplinary and expulsion policies do not discriminate against educational choice students.
- (6) From funds allocated to Dade County through the Florida Education Finance Program, the program shall provide each student with a scholarship equal to the amount of funds that would be allocated for the student for dropout prevention pursuant to s. 236.081, Florida Statutes, or the regularly charged tuition and fees, including transportation costs where appropriate, at the nonpublic school, whichever is less. Scholarships provided pursuant to this section are grants-in-aid to children through their parents or guardians and not to the schools in which the children are enrolled. The selection of the school by parents or guardians shall not constitute a decision or act of the state or any of its subdivisions. The scholarships shall not constitute taxable income.
- (7) Each participating nonpublic school shall file an annual report with the Department of Education which indicates each student's academic and behavioral performance, including

progress in the areas identified as qualifying the student for a dropout prevention program. The program shall include a component for annual and cumulative evaluations of effectiveness. The Department of Education shall select an independent entity to conduct the evaluations which shall contain annual recommendations for legislative and administrative change to the program. results of these evaluations shall be made available to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 1 for each year of the program. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. HOUSE SUMMARY Requires the Department of Education to institute a 3-year pilot scholarship program in Dade County, to be administered by the School Board of Dade County, for eligible students at public or nonpublic schools.
