## I. SUMMARY:

HB 1455 creates the Video Lottery Purse Trust Fund under the administration of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. Funds shall be credited to this trust fund as provided in s. 24.1121, F.S., as created in HB 1453. Section 550.26315, F.S., as created in HB 1453, provides for conditions relating to the distribution of funds. Any balance in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year shall remain in the trust fund. The trust fund shall be terminated on July 1, 2003.

HB 1455 shall take effect July 1, 1999, contingent upon passage of implementing legislation.

## II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

#### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

Gaming on video lottery terminals is not presently lawful in the state. Therefore, no trust fund exists to receive revenue from this source.

#### B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

HB 1455 creates the Video Lottery Purse Trust Fund under the administration of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. Funds credited to the trust fund shall follow provisions of s. 24.1121, F.S., which is created in Section 8 of HB 1453. Disbursed funds shall follow the provisions of s. 550.26315, F.S., which is created in Section 18 of HB 1453.

Section 24.1121, F.S., requires that 8 percent of the net terminal revenue from the operation of video lottery gaming be credited to the Video Lottery Purse Trust Fund for distribution in accordance with s. 550.26315, F.S.

Section 550.26315, F.S., requires 58 percent of Video Lottery Purse Trust Fund to be transferred to the Video Lottery Thoroughbred Trust Fund and requires that 42 percent of Video Lottery Purse Trust Fund proceeds be distributed to pari-mutuel permit holders to be distributed as purses according to a specified formula.

Funds in the Video Lottery Purse Trust Fund at the end of the fiscal year, shall remain in the trust fund and be available for carrying out the purposes of the trust fund.

The trust fund shall terminate on or before July 1, 2003. However, prior to the trust fund's termination, a review shall be executed.
