25	Section 1. Subsection (7) is added to section 401.25,
26	Florida Statutes, to read:
27	401.25 Licensure as a basic life support or an

29	(7)(a) Each permitted basic-life-support ambulance of
30	a licensee not specifically exempted from this part, when
31	transporting a person who is sick, injured, wounded,

1 incapacitated, or helpless, must be occupied by at least two persons: one patient attendant who is a certified emergency 2 3 medical technician, certified paramedic, or licensed physician and one ambulance driver who meets the requirements of s. 4 5 401.281. This subsection does not apply to interfacility б transfers governed by s. 401.252(1). (b) Each permitted advanced-life-support ambulance of 7 8 a licensee not specifically exempted from this part, when transporting a person who is sick, injured, wounded, 9 10 incapacitated, or helpless must be occupied by at least two 11 persons: one who is a certified paramedic or licensed physician and one who is a certified emergency medical 12 technician, certified paramedic, or licensed physician who 13 also meets the requirements of s. 401.281 for drivers. The 14 person with the highest medical certifications shall be in 15 charge of patient care. This subsection does not apply to 16 17 interfacility transfers governed by s. 401.252(1). Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 401.27, Florida 18 19 Statutes, is amended to read: 401.27 Personnel; standards and certification.--20 (3) Any person who desires to be certified or 21 recertified as an emergency medical technician or paramedic 22 must apply under oath to the department on forms provided by 23 24 the department which shall contain such information as the 25 department reasonably requires and which may include affirmative evidence of ability to comply with applicable laws 26 27 and rules. The department shall determine whether the 28 applicant meets the requirements specified in this section and 29 in rules of the department and shall issue a certificate to any person who meets such requirements. 30 31

Present subsection (2) of section 401.30, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is redesignated as 2 3 subsection (3), and a new subsection (2) is added to that section, to read: 4 5 401.30 Records.-б (2) Each licensee must provide the receiving hospital 7 with a copy of an individual patient care record for each 8 patient who is transported to the hospital. The information 9 contained on the record and the method and timeframe for 10 providing the record shall be prescribed by rule of the 11 department. Section 4. Section 401.49, Florida Statutes, is 4 created to read: 5 401.49 Approval of emergency medical technicians and б paramedic programs. --7 (1) Any private or public institution in this state 8 which desires to conduct an approved program for educating emergency medical technicians and paramedics must submit to 9 10 the department a completed application on a form provided by 11 the department which includes: (a) Evidence that the institution is in compliance 12 13 with all applicable requirements of the Department of 14 Education. (b) Evidence that the institution has an agreement of 15 affiliation with a hospital that has an emergency department 16 17 staffed by at least one physician and one registered nurse. (c) Evidence that the institution has an agreement of 18 19 affiliation with an emergency medical service provider that holds a current license in this state. Such agreement must 20 include, at a minimum, a commitment by the provider to conduct 21 the field-experience portion of the education program. 22 (d) Documentation verifying that the institution's 23 24 faculty includes: 25 1. 2. A program director who is responsible for the
operation, organization, periodic review, administration,

(e) Documentation verifying that the curriculum:
1. Meets the course guides and instructor's lesson
plans in the most recent Emergency Medical Technician Basic
National Standard Curricula for emergency medical technician
programs and the Emergency Medical Technician Paramedic
National Standard Curricula for paramedic programs.
2. Includes 2 hours of instruction on the trauma
scorecard methodologies for assessment of adult trauma
patients and pediatric trauma patients, as specified by the
department by rule.
3. Includes 4 hours of instruction on HIV and AIDS,
which is consistent with the requirements of chapter 381.
(f) Evidence that the institution has sufficient
medical and educational equipment to meet the program needs
for training in emergency medical services.
(2) The department must schedule a site visit to the
applicant's institution within 30 days after notifying the
institution that the application is accepted. During the site
visit, the department must determine the applicant's
compliance with the following criteria:
(a) The program for emergency medical technicians must
require a minimum of 110 hours, with at least 20 hours of
supervised clinical supervision that includes 10 hours in a
hospital emergency department.
(b) The program for paramedics must be available only
to an emergency medical technician who is certified in this
state or to an applicant for certification in this state as an
emergency medical technician who obtains such certification

1 prior to completing phase one of the paramedic program. The paramedic program must require a minimum of 700 hours of 2 3 didactic and skills-practice components, with a student-to-instructor ratio for the skills laboratory which 4 5 does not exceed six to one. A paramedic program must provide б field-internship experience aboard an ALS permitted ambulance. 7 After completing the site visit, the department (3) 8 shall provide a report to the institution. Upon completion of the report, the application is complete and s. 120.60 applies. 9 If the program is approved, the department shall 10 (4) 11 issue the institution a 2-year certificate of approval as an emergency medical technician training program or a paramedic 12 training program. If the application is denied, the department 13 must notify the applicant of areas of strength, areas that 14 need improvement, and suggested means of improving the 15 program. A notice of denial must be provided to the applicant 16 17 so that the applicant has at least 5 days prior to the expiration of the application-processing time provided under 18 19 s. 120.60 in which to advise the department in writing of its intent to submit a plan of correction. Notice of such intent 20 tolls the time for processing the application s. 120.60. The 21 plan of correction must be submitted to the department within 22 30 days after the notice. Each approved program 11 must require its students to pass a comprehensive final written and practical examination that evaluates the skills 12 described in the most current Emergency Medical Technician 13 Basic or Emergency Medical Technician Paramedic National 14 Standard Curriculum of the United States Department of 15 Transportation. Each approved program must issue a 16 17 certification of completion to a graduate within 14 days after successful completion of the program. 18 19 Section 6. Section 401.50, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 20 21 401.50 Recertification training of emergency medical technicians and paramedics .--22 (1) The department shall establish by rule criteria 23 24 for all emergency medical technician and paramedic recertification training. The rules must require at least 30 25 hours of recertification training and must include the 26 27 performance parameters for adult and pediatric emergency medical clinical care, which are documented through a system 28 29 of recordkeeping. 30 (2) Any individual, institution, school, corporation, 31 or governmental entity may conduct emergency medical 7

1 technician or paramedic recertification training upon 2 application to the department and payment of a nonrefundable 3 fee to be deposited into the Emergency Medical Services Trust 4 Fund. Institutions conducting department-approved educational 5 programs as provided in this part and licensed ambulance б services are exempt from the application process and payment 7 of fees. The department shall adopt rules for the application 8 and payment of a fee not to exceed the actual cost of the 9 administration of the requirements of this subsection. 10 (3) To be eligible for recertification as provided in s. 401.27, a certified medical technician or paramedic must 11 12 provide evidence to the department that the applicant has completed the training required for recertification under this 13 14 section. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. 21 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 1476 22 23 24 The committee substitute substantially revises the original bill to only provide for the Department of Health's authority: 25 to approve training programs for emergency medical technicians and paramedics; to require recertification training for emergency medical technicians and paramedics that must include 26 27 medical clinical care; to impose minimum requirements on permitted emergency medical vehicles; and to require documents and other information to be submitted under oath by emergency 28 29 medical services licensees, emergency medical services certificate holders, or applicants to the department. 30 31 8
