I. SUMMARY:

This bill increases the annual salary of the Port of Palm Beach District's board commissioners (board) from \$4,800 to \$9,500. It has been 18 years since the board's last raise. The bill also provides commissioners with an automatic annual 3 percent salary increase.

There is a fiscal impact to the district.

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II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

Chapter 74-570, Laws of Florida, as amended by chapter 81-459, Laws of Florida, provides for the operation and maintenance of the Port of Palm Beach District in Palm Beach County. According to the 1991-1999 Official List of Special Districts, the Port of Palm Beach District is an independent special district created in 1989.

The chapter, as amended, also establishes the organization and compensation of its board of commissioners. The district's commissioners received its last pay raise in 1981 when the commissioners' salary increased from \$2,400 to their present salary of \$4,800.

The district is authorized to fund the needs of the district through its ad valorem taxes and assessment powers. However, the district does not levy any ad valorem taxation, rather, revenues for the district are derived primarily from port assessments.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

The bill provides for a \$4,700 salary increase for the Port of Palm Beach District commissioners, raising their salaries to \$9,500 from \$4,800. In addition, the commissioners will receive an automatic annual 3 percent salary increase. According to the 1999 Economic Impact Statement, proceeds for the salary increase will come solely from port revenue.

The bill also corrects gender bias language.
