I. SUMMARY:

The bill revises the definition of port jurisdictional area and revises the territorial boundaries of the port jurisdictional area. Repeals the prior special act providing certain authority to the county administrator to enter into a lease whose term does not exceed 1 year.

II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

Chapter 91-356, Laws of Florida: Amended the Port Everglades District (District) jurisdictional area. The functions of the District including, in part, the following:

- To operate, maintain, and manage port and harbor facilities;
- To create and promote commerce and industry within the county;
- To participate in the establishment and operation of a transportation system associated with the port jurisdictional area;
- To plan, construct, maintain, operate, manage, improve, and regulate harbor and port facilities;
- To handle, weigh, measure, regulate, inspect, and recondition all commodities and cargo received or shipped through the harbor and port facilities;
- To do all things necessary or convenient to establish, regulate, operate, and maintain foreign trade zones, authorized pursuant to state or federal law;
- To do all things necessary or convenient to regulate, maintain, and improve all navigable and nonnavigable waters within the port jurisdictional area necessary for the operation, improvement, and maintenance of port and harbor facilities;
- Within the geographic boundaries of Broward County, to acquire, construct, lease, establish, improve, maintain, and operate a railroad and all necessary or convenient appurtenances for the use of passengers, freight, and railroads; and
- To take any other action which is necessary or convenient to carry out the purposes of this act.

Chapter 94-429, Laws of Florida: Amended the Port Everglades District and Port Everglades Authority in Broward County. Provided the legislative intent, definitions, and port jurisdictional area.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

The bill increases the Port Everglades District jurisdictional area, adding, approximately, 271 acres. The bill also repeals a prior special act section which authorized the county administrator to enter into leases whose term does not exceed one year.

E. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS:

Section 1: Amends subsection (3) of section 2 of chapter 94-429, Laws of Florida, deleting the reference to the definition of the "Port jurisdictional area" as that contained in the Charter of Port Everglades in chapter 89-427, Laws of Florida. Provides for the definition of "Port jurisdictional area" to be the legal description contained in section 3 of this bill.

Section 2: Repeals subsection (2) of section 6 of chapter 94-429, Laws of Florida, relating to the county administrator entering into and executing leases of terms of less than 1 year. Renumbers subsection (3) and (4) as subsections (2) and (3). Renumbers sections (2) and (3). Renumbers

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section 3 through 15 as sections 4 through 16. Creates a new section 3, providing the legal description for the Port Jurisdictional Area.

Section 3: Repeals Chapter 91-356, Laws of Florida, relating to the jurisdictional boundaries of the District.

Section 4: Provides that the act will become effective upon becoming a law.
