Subsection (5) of section 196.012, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 11 12 196.012 Definitions. -- For the purpose of this chapter, the following terms are defined as follows, except where the 13 context clearly indicates otherwise: 14 "Educational institution" means a federal, state, 15 parochial, church, or private school, college, or university 16 17 conducting regular classes and courses of study required for eligibility to certification by, accreditation to, or 18 19 membership in the State Department of Education of Florida, 20 Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, or the Florida 21 Council of Independent Schools; a nonprofit private school the 22 principal activity of which is conducting regular classes and 23 courses of study accepted for continuing postgraduate dental education credit by a board of the Division of Medical Quality 24 25 Assurance; educational direct-support organizations created pursuant to ss. 229.8021, 240.299, and 240.331; and facilities 26 27 located on the property of eligible entities which will become 28 owned by those entities on a date certain; and FAA Part 142 29 training facilities, schools, or businesses that train

aircraft pilots and flight crews for approval, certification,

or regulation by the Federal Aviation Administration or comparable foreign regulatory authorities. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law and shall apply to tax years that begin on or after January 1, 1999.
