27	national and international media promotion and attention to								
28	the extent of promoting the quality of life in Florida so as								
29	to attract national and international tourists and								
30	sports-related industry, and

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WHEREAS, additional generated tourism has a positive 1 2 impact on both the taxes and economy of the state and 3 additional economic development enhances employment 4 opportunities for Florida citizens as well as expanding the 5 tax base, and 6 WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has directed the 7 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development to guide, 8 stimulate, and promote the sports industry in the state, and 9 WHEREAS, the establishment of a World Bowling Village 10 facility would, in addition to educational and job opportunity enhancement, accomplish the goals established for sports 11 12 promotion in the state, NOW, THEREFORE, 13 14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 15 16 Section 1. Paragraph (f) of subsection (6) of section 17 212.20, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read: 18 212.20 Funds collected, disposition; additional powers 19 of department; operational expense; refund of taxes adjudicated unconstitutionally collected .--20 21 (6) Distribution of all proceeds under this chapter shall be as follows: 22 23 (f) The proceeds of all other taxes and fees imposed pursuant to this chapter shall be distributed as follows: 24 1. In any fiscal year, the greater of \$500 million, 25 26 minus an amount equal to 4.6 percent of the proceeds of the 27 taxes collected pursuant to chapter 201, or 5 percent of all other taxes and fees imposed pursuant to this chapter shall be 28 29 deposited in monthly installments into the General Revenue 30 Fund. 31 2 CODING: Words stricken are deletions; words underlined are additions.

2. Two-tenths of one percent shall be transferred to 1 2 the Solid Waste Management Trust Fund. 3 3. After the distribution under subparagraphs 1. and 4 2., 9.653 percent of the amount remitted by a sales tax dealer 5 located within a participating county pursuant to s. 218.61 6 shall be transferred into the Local Government Half-cent Sales 7 Tax Clearing Trust Fund. 4. Section 288.1171, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 22 23 288.1171 World Bowling Village facility; duties .--The Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 24 (1) Development shall serve as the state agency for screening 25 26 applicants for state funding pursuant to s. 212.20 and for 27 certifying one applicant as the World Bowling Village facility 28 in the state. 29 (2) Prior to certifying the World Bowling Village facility, the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 30 Development must determine that: 31 4

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1	(a) The World Bowling Village facility is a bowling									
2	complex consisting of bowling lanes, stadium seating, offices,									
3	a national training center, and a research and development

5	(b) The applicant is a unit of local government as

15	methodology approved by the Office of Tourism, Trade, and

19	Village facility will equal or exceed \$2 million annually.									
20	(e) Documentation exists that demonstrates that the									
21	applicant has provided, is capable of providing, or has									
22	financial or other commitments to provide more than one-half									
23	of the costs incurred or related to the improvement and									
24	development of the facility.									
25	(f) The application is signed by an official senior									
26	executive of the applicant and is notarized according to									
27	Florida law providing for penalties for falsification.									
28	(g) The World Bowling Village facility applicant has									
29	submitted an agreement to provide \$2 million annually in									
30	national and international media promotion of the World									
31	Bowling Village facility, Florida, Central Florida, and									
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Florida tourism through the World Bowling Village facility at 1 the then current commercial rate, during the period of time 2 3 that the facility receives funds pursuant to s. 212.20. The 4 Office of Tourism, Trade and Economic Development and the 5 World Bowling Village facility must agree annually on a 6 reasonable percentage of advertising specifically allocated 7 for generic Florida advertising. Failure on the part of the World Bowling Village facility to annually provide the 8 9 advertising as provided in this paragraph shall result in the termination of funding as provided in s. 212.20. 10 (3) The applicant may use funds provided pursuant to 11 12 s. 212.20 for the public purpose of paying for the construction, reconstruction, renovation, furnishings, 13 14 equipment, or operation of the World Bowling Village facility, 15 or to pay or pledge for payment of debt service on, or to fund debt service reserve funds, arbitrage rebate obligations, or 16 17 other amounts payable with respect to, bonds issued for the construction, reconstruction, build-out, or renovation of the 18 19 facility or for the reimbursement of such costs or the 20 refinancing of bonds issued for such purpose. 21 (4) Upon determining that an applicant is or is not certifiable, the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 22 23 Development shall notify the applicant of his or her status by means of an official letter. If certifiable, the Office of 24 Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development shall notify the 25 26 executive director of the Department of Revenue and the 27 applicant of such certification by means of an official letter 28 granting certification. From the date of such certification, 29 the applicant shall have 5 years to open the World Bowling Village facility to the public and notify the Office of 30 31 Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development of such opening. 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Department of Revenue shall not begin distributing funds until 1 2 30 days following notice by the Office of Tourism, Trade, and 3 Economic Development that the World Bowling Village facility is open to the public. 4 5 (5) The Department of Revenue may audit as provided in 6 s. 213.34 to verify that the distributions under this section 7 have been expended as required by this section. 8 (6) The Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 9 Development must recertify every 10 years that the facility is open and is meeting the minimum projections for sales tax 10 revenues as required at the time of original certification. 11 12 If the facility is not certified as meeting the minimum 13 projections, then funding will be abated until certification 14 criteria are met. If the project fails to generate \$2 million 15 of annual revenues pursuant to paragraph (2)(d), the 16 distribution of revenues pursuant to s. 212.20(6)(f)5.d. shall 17 be reduced to an amount equal to \$166,667 multiplied by a fraction, the numerator of which is the actual revenues 18 19 generated and the denominator of which is \$2 million.
