I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the University of Florida Health Center Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund without modification, for the period July 1, 2003, through November 4, 2004. This puts the trust fund on the same review cycle as all other education trust funds.

This bill re-creates section 240.513(3)(a), Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

The University of Florida Health Center Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund, FLAIR number 49-2-424, is administered by the State University System. This fund was created effective July 1, 1995, by Chapter 95-113, L.O.F. SB 584 re-creates the fund from July 1, 1999, until July 1, 2003.

The purpose of the University of Florida Health Center Operations and Maintenance Trust Fund is to account for and expend revenue generated from the operations of the University of Florida Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification. It extends the effective date from July 1, 2003, through November 4, 2004, which puts it on the same review cycle as all other education trust funds.
