30 31 Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 316.211, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.211 Equipment for motorcycle and moped riders.--

(3) This section shall not apply to persons riding within an enclosed cab or to any person 16 years of age or older who is operating or riding upon a motorcycle powered by a motor with a displacement of 50 cubic centimeters or less or is rated not in excess of 2 brake horsepower and which is not capable of propelling such motorcycle at a speed greater than 30 miles per hour on level ground, or to persons over the age of 21 years. In order to ride a motorcycle without wearing protective headgear a person over the age of 21 must obtain bodily injury liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$20,000 per person, \$40,000 per accident and medical payment coverage for the driver and all passengers of the motorcycle of at least \$10,000 for the driver and each person. The operator of the motorcycle must have proof of insurance on his or her person in order to operate the motorcycle and shall be required to provide proof of insurance upon demand by any law enforcement officer.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.

## HOUSE SUMMARY

Provides that persons over the age of 21 years do not need protective headgear to operate a motorcycle so long as the person obtains bodily injury liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$20,000 per person, \$40,000 per accident and medical payment coverage for the driver and all passengers of the motorcycle of at least \$10,000 for the driver and each passenger. Provides that the operator of the motorcycle must have proof of insurance on his or of the motorcycle must have proof of insurance on his or her person in order to operate the motorcycle and shall be required to provide proof of insurance upon demand to any law enforcement officer.
