Such message may not exceed 2 minutes in length 17 and may include, but is not limited to, an invocation, prayer, poetry, or inspirational thought. If the participating 18 19 student body chooses to use such a message: 20 The message must be given by a student volunteer, (1)21 chosen by the participating student body. The content of the message must be prepared by the 22 (2) 23 student volunteer and shall not be monitored or otherwise reviewed by the district school board, its officers, or its 24 25 employees. 26 The purpose of this act is to allow the students to 27 participate and direct their own message without monitoring or 28 review by school officials. 29 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 31 law.
