This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. 21 22 23 HOUSE SUMMARY 24 Prohibits any parent, legal guardian, or other person responsible for a child younger than 10 years of age from leaving such a child unattended or unsupervised in a 25 motor vehicle for any period of time and prohibits leaving children who are between the ages of 10 and 15 26 unattended or unsupervised in a motor vehicle for a period of time in excess of 15 minutes.
