Section 365.174, Florida Statutes, is 19 created to read: 20 365.174 Proprietary and confidential information. --Any record, recording, or information, or portions 21 22 thereof, which is obtained by a public agency, public safety 23 agency, or county for the purposes of providing services in an emergency and which reveals the name, address, or telephone 24 25 number of, or personal information about, or information that 26 may identify, any person who requests emergency service or who reports an emergency by accessing an emergency 911 telephone 27 2.8 system is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 29 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, except that such 30 record or information may be disclosed to a public safety This exemption applies only to information that may

identify a person who reports an emergency while such information is in the custody of the public agency, public safety agency, or answering point that receives the initial 911 telephone call.

- (2) All proprietary and confidential information submitted by a provider to the board or the department, including the names and billing or service addresses of service subscribers, and trade secrets as defined by s. 812.081, is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. Statistical abstracts of information collected by the board or the department may be released or published, but only in a manner that does not identify or allow identification of subscribers or their service numbers or of revenues attributable to any provider.
- (3) As used in this section, the term "proprietary information" means customer lists and other related information, technology descriptions, technical information, or trade secrets, including the term "trade secrets" as defined in s. 812.081, and the actual or developmental costs of E911 systems that are developed, produced, or received internally by a provider or by a provider's employees, directors, officers, or agents.
- (4) This section is subject to the Open Government
 Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and is
 repealed on October 1, 2004, unless reviewed and saved from
 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature before that
 date.
- Section 2. The exemption from the public records law provided by this act for persons who request emergency services or report an emergency through use of emergency 911 services promotes the unrestrained use of emergency 911

services to provide expedited medical and law enforcement services to persons in need of emergency assistance. The exemption from the public records law provided in this act for proprietary information is necessary to foster competition in the wireless telecommunications services industry and to protect the competitive interests of the providers of such information. Section 3. This act shall take effect on the effective date of Senate Bill ____, relating to wireless emergency 911 telephone service, but shall not take effect if such legislation does not become a law. ********** SENATE SUMMARY Exempts from the public records law information that discloses the identity of persons who request emergency services or report an emergency through use of wireless emergency 911 services, the names and billing addresses of service subscribers, and trade secrets of wireless emergency 911 service providers. Provides for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption.
