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19	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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21	Section 1. Section 24.1153, Florida Statutes, is
22	created to read:
23	24.1153 Assignment of prizes payable in installments
24	over time
25	(1) The right of any person to receive payments under
26	a prize that is paid in installments over time by the
27	department may be voluntarily assigned, in whole or in part,
28	if the assignment is made to a person or entity designated
29	pursuant to an order of a court of competent jurisdiction
30	located in the judicial district where the assigning prize
31	winner resides or where the headquarters of the department is
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1 located. A court may issue an order approving a voluntary assignment and directing the department to make prize payments 2 3 in whole or in part to the designated assignee, if the court finds that all of the following conditions have been met: 4 5 The assignment is in writing, is executed by the (a) б assignor, and is, by its terms, subject to the laws of this 7 state. 8 (b) The purchase price being paid for the payments 9 being assigned represents a present value of the payments 10 being assigned, discounted at an annual rate that does not 11 exceed the state's usury limit for loans. 12 (c) The assignor provides a sworn affidavit attesting 13 that he or she: 1. Is of sound mind, is in full command of his or her 14 faculties, and is not acting under duress; 15 Has been advised regarding the assignment by his or 16 2. her own independent legal counsel, who is unrelated to and is 17 not being compensated by the assignee or any of the assignee's 18 19 affiliates, and has received independent financial or tax 20 advice concerning the effects of the assignment from a lawyer or other professional who is unrelated to and is not being 21 22 compensated by the assignee or any of the assignee's 23 affiliates; 24 3. Understands that he or she will not receive the prize payments or portions thereof for the years assigned; 25 26 Understands and agrees that with regard to the 4. 27 assigned payments the department and its officials and 28 employees will have no further liability or responsibility to 29 make the assigned payments to him or her; 5. Has been provided with a one-page written 30 disclosure statement setting forth, in bold type of not less 31

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1 than 14 points, the payments being assigned, by amounts and payment dates; the purchase price being paid; the rate of 2 3 discount to present value, assuming daily compounding and funding on the contract date; and the amount, if any, of any 4 5 origination or closing fees that will be charged to him or б her; and 7 Was advised in writing, at the time he or she 6. 8 signed the assignment contract, that he or she had the right to cancel the contract, without any further obligation, within 9 10 3 business days following the date on which the contract was 11 signed. (d) Written notice of the proposed assignment and any 12 court hearing concerning the proposed assignment is provided 13 to the department's counsel at least 10 days prior to any 14 court hearing. The department is not required to appear in or 15 be named as a party to any such action seeking judicial 16 17 confirmation of an assignment under this section, but may 18 intervene as of right in any such proceeding. 19 (2) In accordance with the provisions of s. 24.115(4), a voluntary assignment may not include or cover payments or 20 21 portions of payments that are subject to offset on account of a defaulted or delinquent child-support obligation or on 22 account of a debt owed to a state agency, unless appropriate 23 24 provision is made in the court order to satisfy the obligations giving rise to the offset. 25 The department, and its respective officials and 26 (3) 27 employees, shall be discharged of all liability upon payment of an assigned prize under this section. 28 29 The department may establish a reasonable fee to (4) 30 defray any administrative expenses associated with assignments made under this section, including the cost to the department 31

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1 of any processing fee that may be imposed by a private annuity provider. The fee amount shall reflect the direct and indirect 2 3 costs associated with processing such assignments. 4 (5) If at any time the Internal Revenue Service or a 5 court of competent jurisdiction issues a determination letter, б revenue ruling, other public ruling of the Internal Revenue Service, or published decision to any state lottery or prize 7 8 winner of any state lottery declaring that the voluntary assignment of prizes will affect the federal income tax 9 10 treatment of prize winners who do not assign their prizes, the 11 secretary of the department shall immediately file a copy of that letter, ruling, or published decision with the Secretary 12 of State and the Office of the State Courts Administrator. A 13 14 court may not issue an order authorizing a voluntary 15 assignment under this section after the date any such ruling, letter, or published decision is filed. 16 (6) Prize winners entitled to choose between payment 17 18 options may elect to receive a lump sum cash award only during 19 the 60-day period commencing after the winning draw date. 20 With regard to any prize paid over a course of (7) years in accordance with a schedule established by the 21 department at the time of award, the department shall not 22 alter the timing or amount of scheduled payments or otherwise 23 24 accelerate, defer, commute, or discount such scheduled 25 payments. Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 26 27 24.115, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 24.115 Payment of prizes.--28 29 (1) The department shall promulgate rules to establish a system of verifying the validity of tickets claimed to win 30

31 prizes and to effect payment of such prizes; however:

13	(2) UNLAWFUL ASSIGNMENT OR TRANSFER OF RIGHT TO CLAIM
14	PRIZEExcept as authorized in s. 24.1153, any person who
15	induces another to assign or transfer his or her right to
16	claim a prize, who offers for sale his or her right to claim a
17	prize, or who offers for compensation to claim the prize of
18	another is guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree,
19	punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

23	SENATE SUMMARY
24	Authorizes the assignment of certain lottery prizes
25	pursuant to a court order. Provides requirements for such assignments and provides for the securing of funds offset
26	for child-support payments or debts owed to a state agency. Exempts the Department of the Lottery from
27	liability upon the payment of an assigned prize. Authorizes an administrative fee to defray administrative
28	expenses associated with such assignments. Provides circumstances under which court orders may not be issued.
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
