(1) Effective July 1, 1999, all powers, duties, functions, records, personnel, property, and unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, and other funds of the Agency for Health Care Administration which relate to consumer complaint services, investigations, and prosecutorial services and which are currently provided by the Agency for Health Care Administration under a contract with the Department of Health, are transferred by a type two transfer, as defined in section 20.06(2), Florida Statutes, to the Department of Health. Any rules adopted by or for the Agency for Health Care Administration for the purpose of administering or operating such programs are included in this transfer and shall remain in effect until specifically changed in the manner provided by law.
