In addition, the member's 10 duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, 11 apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law 12 violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb 13 disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member 14 15 must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or 16 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, 17 administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 18 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 19 20 included;
