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13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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15	Section 1. (1) The Task Force on Public School
16	Funding is created to examine and make recommendations to the
17	Governor and the Legislature on the funding of the state
18	system of public schools. The task force is assigned to the
19	Office of Legislative Services, created by section 11.147,
20	Florida Statutes, for administrative and fiscal accountability
21	purposes.
22	(2) The task force shall consist of 15 members
23	selected from among business and community leaders and the
24	Lieutenant Governor and Commissioner of Education, who shall
25	serve as voting ex officio members. By June 30, 1999, the
26	Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the
27	House of Representatives shall each appoint 5 members to serve
28	for the duration of the task force. If a vacancy occurs, the
29	official who had appointment jurisdiction for the vacated
30	position shall appoint a member to fill the vacancy. Each
31	appointing authority may remove his or her appointee for
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1 cause, and shall remove an appointee who, without cause, fails to attend three consecutive meetings. Members of the task 2 3 force shall serve without compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses incurred in the 4 5 performance of their duties as provided in section 112.061, б Florida Statutes. 7 (3) The task force shall hold its organizational 8 meeting by September 1, 1999; and, thereafter, shall meet at 9 the call of the chair, but shall meet at least monthly before submitting its final recommendations. The task force shall be 10 11 chaired by a member designated by the Governor. The task force shall elect a vice chair to serve in the absence of the 12 chair. The task force shall adopt procedures or bylaws 13 necessary for its efficient operation and may appoint 14 subcommittees from its membership. 15 The task force shall examine the funding of state 16 (4) 17 system of public schools as provided by the Florida Education Finance Program created by section 236.081, Florida Statutes, 18 19 and implemented by the general appropriations acts. The task force shall consider at least the following: 20 21 The funding of public schools based on their (a) performance in educating students as evidenced by the 22 achieving of equitable outcomes that meet the state academic 23 24 achievement standards for all students. 25 (b) The relationship between state funding and local funding for public schools. 26 27 The maintenance of funding equity in the (C) 28 allocation of dollars among school districts and schools. 29 The acquisition and support of technology to (d) 30 assist in the instructional process. 31

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1 (e) The funding support for parental choice in the 2 selection of educational services for children. 3 (f) The results and recommendations of public school funding studies conducted by nationally recognized experts, 4 5 groups, and other states. (5) б The task force: 7 Shall appoint an executive director, who shall (a) 8 serve under its direction, supervision, and control. The 9 executive director shall be the chief administrative officer 10 of the task force. Subject to approval by the task force, the 11 executive director shall employ, direct, and control research and support staff to serve the task force and its 12 subcommittees. All employees of the task force are exempt 13 from the Career Service System. The Commissioner of Education 14 shall designate personnel of the Department of Education to 15 assist the task force until its staff is employed. 16 17 (b) May enter into contracts or agreements with nationally recognized school-finance experts to serve in a 18 19 consulting and advisory capacity. (c) May apply for and accept funds, grants, donations, 20 21 expenses, in-kind services, and other valued goods or services from the government of the United States or any of its 22 agencies or any other public or private sources. Funds or 23 24 services acquired or accepted under this paragraph must be used to carry out the task force's duties and 25 responsibilities. 26 27 Shall keep full, detailed, and accurate records (C) pursuant to chapter 119, Florida Statutes. 28 (d) By September 1, 2000, shall submit draft 29 30 recommendations and, by February 1, 2002, shall submit final recommendations to the Governor, the President of the Senate, 31 3

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1	and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Before
2	adopting final recommendations, the task force shall conduct
3	at least one public hearing in each of the five service
4	regions of the Department of Education between September 1 and
5	December 31, 2001.
6	(6) This section expires June 30, 2002.
7	Section 2. <u>Section 236.081</u> , Florida Statutes, 1998
8	Supplement, is repealed effective June 30, 2001, subject to
9	prior review by the Task Force on Public School Funding.
10	Section 3. Effective July 1, 1999, the sum of \$800,000
11	is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of
12	Legislative Services to cover the expenses of the Task Force
13	on Public School Funding created by this act.
14	Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
15	law.
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18	SENATE SUMMARY
19	Creates the Task Force on Public School Funding and specifies its membership and duties. Repeals s. 236.081,
20	F.S., relating to the Florida Education Finance Program, subject to prior review by the task force. Appropriates
21	funds to pay the expenses of the task force.
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
