This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with section 119.15, Florida 18 19 Statutes, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2004, unless 20 reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the 21 Legislature. 22 Section 2. The Legislature finds that exempting 23 information provided to state attorneys and sheriffs under 24 paragraph 787.03(6)(b), Florida Statutes, by persons fleeing 25 from domestic violence or the threat of it is a public 26 necessity. The information is of sensitive, personal nature 27 concerning individuals who are under threat of physical and 28 psychological harm if their whereabouts is revealed. 29 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999, but it shall not take effect if House Bill 731 or similar 30 31 legislation requiring certain identifying information to be 1
