20	Study Commission, consisting of 9 members. The Governor shall
21	appoint five members and the President of the Senate and the

23	members. The membership of the commission shall reflect a
24	broad range of interests and expertise related to land
25	restoration, acquisition, and management and shall include,
26	but not be limited to, persons with training in hydrogeology,
27	wildlife biology, engineering, real estate, and forestry
28	management, and persons with substantial expertise
29	representing environmental interests, agricultural and
30	silvicultural interests, outdoor recreational interests, and
31	land development interests.

1	(b) Each member of the commission may receive per diem
2	and travel expenses, as provided in s. 112.061, Florida
3	Statutes, while carrying out the official business of the
4	commission.
5	(c) The commission shall be staffed by an executive
6	director and other personnel who are appointed by the
7	commission and who are exempt from part II of chapter 110,
8	Florida Statutes, relating to the Career Service System.
9	(d) The commission shall execute a contract with the
10	Florida Natural Areas Inventory for the scientific assistance
11	necessary to fulfill the requirements of subsection (2).
12	(e) Appointments shall be made by August 15, 1999, and
13	the commission's first meeting shall be held by September 15,
14	1999. The commission shall exist until December 31, 2000. The

- The report shall be based on the following: (b)
- 1. Comments received during a minimum of four public hearings, in different areas of the state, held for the purpose of gathering public input and recommendations.
- 2. An evaluation of Florida's existing public land acquisition programs for conservation, preservation, and recreational purposes, including those administered by the water management districts, to determine the extent of Florida's unmet needs for restoration, acquisition, and management of public lands and water areas and for acquisition of privately owned lands and water areas.
- Material and data developed by the Florida Natural Areas Inventory concerning Florida's conservation lands.
- The commission may make recommendations concerning other aspects of the "Stewardship Florida Act."
- There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$150,000 from the Conservation and Recreation Lands Trust Fund and the sum of \$150,000 from the Water Management Lands Trust Fund to the Executive Office of the Governor for fiscal year 1999-2000 to fund the expenses of the Stewardship Florida Study Commission. Of this appropriation the Florida Natural Areas Inventory shall receive no less than \$50,000 for the contractural services required under paragraph (1)(d).

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
