1 "Home-invasion robbery" means any robbery that (1) 2 occurs when the offender enters a dwelling with the intent to 3 commit a robbery, and does commit a robbery of the occupants 4 therein. 5 (2)(a) If in the course of committing the 6 home-invasion robbery the person carried a firearm or other 7 deadly weapon, the person commits a life felony, punishable as 8 provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 9 (b) If in the course of committing the home-invasion 10 robbery the person carried a weapon, the person commits a felony of the first degree, punishable by imprisonment for a 11 12 term of years not exceeding life imprisonment or as provided 13 in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. Provides that it is a first degree felony punishable for a term of imprisonment not exceeding life to commit a home-invasion robbery in the course of which a weapon is carried. Provides that it is a first degree felony to commit a home-invasion robbery in the course of which no firearm, deadly weapon, or other weapon is carried. Provides penalties. Specifies a minimum 10-year term of imprisonment for conviction of home-invasion robbery. Revises the Criminal Punishment Code offense severity ranking chart, to conform.
