Section 92.57, Florida Statutes, is amended 16 to read: 92.57 Termination of employment of witness 17 prohibited.--A person who testifies in a judicial proceeding 18 19 in response to a subpoena may not be dismissed from 20 employment, or threatened with dismissal from employment, 21 because of the nature of the person's testimony or because of 22 absences from employment resulting from appearances as a 23 witness compliance with the subpoena. The court may hold an employer in contempt if the employer, or his or her agent, 24 25 dismisses from employment or threatens to dismiss an employee 26 because of his or her appearance or testimony as a witness. 27 In any civil action arising out of a violation of this 28 section, the court may award compensatory damages, attorney's 29 fees, and punitive damages to the person unlawfully dismissed, 30 in addition to actual damages suffered by such person. 31 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. 1
