Section 784.062, Florida Statutes, is 22 created to read: 23 784.062 Misuse of laser lighting devices.--(1) As used in this section, the term "laser lighting 24 25 device" means a hand-held device, not affixed to a firearm, 26 which emits a laser beam that is designed to be used by the 27 operator as a pointer or highlighter to indicate, mark, or 28 identify a specific position, place, item, or object. 29 (2) Any person who knowingly and willfully shines, 30 points, or focuses the beam of a laser lighting device at
