Section 163.055, Florida Statutes, is 16 17 created to read: 18 163.055 Local Government Financial Technical 19 Assistance Program. --20 (1) Concerning municipalities and special districts, 21 the Legislature finds that: 22 (a) Florida is a state composed of 400 municipalities and almost 1,000 special districts statewide. 23 (b) Of the 400 municipalities in the state, over 200 24 25 have a population under 5,000. (c) Projected revenue and expenditure trends of many 26 27 small municipalities and special districts indicate that a 28 serious fiscal condition has developed that could require a number of municipalities and special districts to declare 29 30 financial emergencies.

- (e) Millions of dollars are lost every year as many primarily small local governments experience financial deterioration, and many of those ultimately fall into financial emergency status.
- (f) State government lacks the specific technical expertise or resources to effectively perform on-going educational support and financial emergency detection or assistance.
- (2) Recognizing the findings in subsection (1), the Legislature declares that:
- (a) The fiscal emergencies confronting various municipalities and special districts require an investment that will facilitate efforts to improve the productivity and efficiency of their financial structures and operating procedures.
- (b) Current and additional revenue enhancements authorized by the Legislature should be managed and administered using appropriate management practices and expertise.
- (3) The purpose of this section is to provide technical assistance to municipalities and special districts to enable them to implement workable solutions to financially related problems.
- (4) The Comptroller shall enter into contracts with program providers who shall:
- (a) Be a public agency or private, nonprofit corporation, association, or entity.

The findings of the review shall be presented in a report submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Comptroller by January 15 of each year.
