(f) Attach any posters, or directional signs, or 11 12 advertisements to trees or any other tangible property except bulletin boards and other displays designed for such postings. 13 14 (g) Cause or permit a dog or other domestic animal to 15 enter any park facility except for animal shows and other 16 substantially similar special events as then authorized by 17 rules of the department that have been approved by the board of county commissioners. 18 19 (h) Build fires except in specified areas in county parks on cooking grills provided therein, except bonfires 20 directly related to special events may be authorized by the 21 22 director of the department on a case-by-case basis as then 23 authorized by rules of the department approved by the board of 24 county commissioners. (i) Drive any unauthorized vehicle on any area within 25 26 the park except the paved park roads or parking areas; or park 27 any an authorized vehicle in other than an established or designated parking area; or park any unauthorized vehicle in 28 29 the county park area overnight. place other than a bicycle rack when such is provided, or 1 2 leave a bicycle lying on the ground or paving or any place or 3 position so as to present any obstruction to pedestrian or 4 vehicular traffic. 5 (k) Violate any rule for the use of the park which has been posted on any park sign in a particular park pursuant to 6 7 approval by the board of county commissioners including rules and regulations posted on the grounds or buildings in said 8 9 parks. 10 (1) Possess, carry, or transport on or about their person any glass bottle orcontainer out of doors in any county 11 12 park. 13 (m) Injure, kill, molest, collect, possess, or cause 14 direct or indirect injury to any species of sea turtle, gopher tortoises, live sand dollars, shorebirds, birds of prey, live 15 16 shells, and live sea stars or to interfere, destroy, or tamper 17 in any way with the nesting of the sea turtle, birds of prey, 18 gopher tortoises, or shorebirds. 19 (m)(n) Operate or cause to be operated a hand, animal, motor, or engine driven wheel, track or other vehicle or 20 implement on, over or across any part of the sand dune, hill 21 or ridge nearest the Gulf of Mexico, or the vegetation growing 22 23 thereon or seaward thereof, or to operate or drive such a vehicle on the area seaward thereof, commonly referred to as 24 25 the beach. 26 (n) Injure, kill, molest, interfere or tamper with, destroy, collect, carry, transport, possess, or otherwise 27 cause any physical harm to any living turtle, tortoise, 28 29 shorebird, bird of prey, sand dollar, shellfish, sea star, or any nesting of any such living thing except to the extent 30 31 4
