- (1) The department shall issue a license to practice clinical nutrition by endorsement to any applicant who the board certifies as qualified, upon receipt of a completed application and the fees specified in s. 468.508.
- (2) The board shall certify as qualified for licensure by endorsement under this section any applicant who holds a valid license to practice as a clinical nutritionist or a nutrition counselor issued by another state, district, or territory of the United States, if the criteria for issuance of such license are determined by the board to be substantially equivalent to or more stringent than those of this state.

HOUSE SUMMARY Revises part X of chapter 468, F.S., relating to dietetics and nutrition practice, to revise terminology and include regulatory provisions for clinical nutrition practice. Creates the Clinical Nutrition Practice Council to advise the Board of Medicine on the practice. Provides rulemaking authority to the board for such regulation. Provides applicability with respect to currently licensed nutrition counselors, and provides for relicensure of such counselors as clinical nutritionists. Provides that health insurance policies may require that nutrition counseling required in conjunction with other diabetes counseling required in conjunction with other diabetes treatment services be provided by a licensed dietitian/nutritionist or licensed clinical nutritionist. Renames the Dietetics and Nutrition Practice Council as the Dietetics/Nutrition Practice Council, and revises references to the practice to conform. Replaces obsolete references to the Agency for Health Care Administration with references to the Department of Health. See bill for details.
