WHEREAS, on March 6, 1995, Elionne Joseph died in an automobile accident when her car collided with a car driven by a teenager who in an attempt to evade police ran a red light at the intersection of 135th St. and the I-95 off-ramp in Metropolitan Dade County, and

WHEREAS, Ms. Joseph is survived by three minor children, Evane Dorival, Sandie Dorival, and Judith Dorival, and by her ex-husband, Joseph Dorival, with whom she was living during the year before her death, and

WHEREAS, the attorney representing the estate of Elionne Joseph claims that the Dade County Police were pursuing the teenagers improperly and in contravention of a county administrative order that allows pursuits only when officers reasonably believe that the fleeing suspect has committed or attempted to commit a violent felony, and

WHEREAS, such attorney contends that the accident in which Ms. Joseph died was caused by the high-speed police chase, and

WHEREAS, the matter is scheduled for trial during the 2 weeks commencing August 24, 1998, and mediation has been scheduled for July 24, 1998, and

WHEREAS, Metropolitan Dade County has indicated that it is willing to settle the case for an amount in excess of the 31 statutory limit of \$200,000 and that it will stipulate that it
