(1) Effective July 1, 1999, all powers, duties, functions, records, personnel, property, and 18 19 unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, and other 20 funds of the Agency for Health Care Administration which relate to consumer complaint services, investigations, and 21 22 prosecutorial services and which are currently provided by the 23 Agency for Health Care Administration under a contract with the Department of Health, are transferred by a type two 24 25 transfer, as defined in section 20.06(2), Florida Statutes, to 26 the Department of Health. Any rules adopted by or for the 27 Agency for Health Care Administration for the purpose of 28 administering or operating such programs are included in this transfer and shall remain in effect until specifically changed 29 30 in the manner provided by law. 31
