Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

On page 69, between lines 9 and 10,

insert:

Section 56. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 468.309, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

468.309 Certificate; duration; renewal; reversion to inactive status.--

(1)(a) A radiologic technologist's certificate issued in accordance with this part ~~automatically~~ expires as specified in rules adopted by the department which establish a procedure for the biennial renewal of certificates ~~on December 31 of the year following the year of issuance.~~ A certificate shall be renewed by the department for a period of 2 years upon payment of a renewal fee in an amount not to exceed \$75 and upon submission of a renewal application containing such information as the department deems necessary to show that the applicant for renewal is a radiologic technologist in good
