Subsections (4), (7), and (8) and paragraph 29 (a) of subsection (6) of section 409.8132, Florida Statutes, 30 1998 Supplement, are amended to read: 31 409.8132 Medikids program component. --

- (4) APPLICABILITY OF LAWS RELATING TO MEDICAID. -- The provisions of ss. 409.902, 409.905, 409.906, 409.907, 409.908, 409.910,409.912, 409.9121, 409.9122, 409.9123, 409.9124, 409.9127, 409.9128, 409.913, 409.916, 409.919, 409.920, and 409.9205 apply to the administration of the Medikids program component of the Florida Kidcare program, except that s. 409.9122 applies to Medikids as modified by the provisions of subsection (7).
 - (6) ELIGIBILITY.--

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- (a) A child who has attained the age of 1 year but who is under the age of 5 years is eligible to enroll in the Medikids program component of the Florida Kidcare program, if the child is a member of a family that has a family income which exceeds the Medicaid applicable income level as specified in s. 409.903, but which is equal to or below 200 percent of the current federal poverty level. In determining the eligibility of such a child, an assets test is not required. A child who is eligible for Medikids may elect to enroll in Florida Healthy Kids coverage or employer-sponsored group coverage. However, a child who is eligible for Medikids may participate in the Florida Healthy Kids program only if the child has a sibling participating in the Florida Healthy Kids program and the child's county of residence permits such enrollment.
- (7) ENROLLMENT. -- Enrollment in the Medikids program component may only occur during periodic open enrollment periods as specified by the agency. During the first 12 months of the program, there shall be at least one, but no more than three, open enrollment periods. The initial open enrollment period shall be for 90 days, and subsequent open enrollment 31 periods during the first year of operation of the program

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shall be for 30 days. After the first year of the program, the 1 agency shall determine the frequency and duration of open enrollment periods. An applicant may apply for enrollment in the Medikids program component and proceed through the eligibility determination process at any time throughout the year. However, enrollment in Medikids shall not begin until the next open enrollment period; and a child may not receive services under the Medikids program until the child is enrolled in a managed care plan or MediPass. In addition, once determined eligible, an applicant may receive choice counseling and select a managed care plan or MediPass. An 12 applicant may select MediPass under the Medikids program 13 component only in counties that have fewer than two managed 14 care plans available to serve Medicaid recipients and only if the federal Health Care Financing Administration determines 16 that MediPass constitutes "health insurance coverage" as defined in Title XXI of the Social Security Act. The agency may implement procedures for the mandatory assignment of Medikids applicants who do not make a voluntary choice of a managed care plan or MediPass. In counties with two or more managed care plans, assignment shall be made among managed care plans. In counties with fewer than two managed care plans, assignment shall be made based on existing Medicaid 24 assignment procedures.

SPECIAL ENROLLMENT PERIODS. -- The agency shall establish a special enrollment period of 30 days' duration for any newborn child who is eligible for Medikids, or for any child who is enrolled in Medicaid if such child loses Medicaid eligibility and becomes eligible for Medikids, or for any child who is enrolled in Medikids if such child moves to

another county that is not within the coverage area of the child's Medikids managed care plan or MediPass provider.

Section 2. Subsection (3) is added to section 409.815, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, to read:

409.815 Health benefits coverage; limitations .--

- is created for children eligible for the Florida Kidcare program as created under ss. 409.810-409.820, except for those children eligible under Medicaid and Medikids. The agency shall develop and administer the Kidcare dental program. Under the Kidcare dental program:
- (a) Dental benefits must include the same services specified in s. 409.906(6), excluding orthodontics.
- (b) Dental providers must be enrolled in the Medicaid program and are to be reimbursed using Medicaid fee-for-service rates.
- (c) The agency shall designate a limited number of sites and a limited number of children to participate in the dental program, using the following criteria:
- 1. Sites selected for the program must comply with the quality assurance and access standards developed under s.

 409.820 and selection as a site must be a condition of program participation. No more than three counties may be selected as sites for the implementation of the program; and
- 2. Enrollment for the entire program may not exceed 1,000 children.

Implementation of the Kidcare dental program is subject to an annual appropriation for that specific purpose and may not result in a decrease in the total number of children served under the program from the previous fiscal year. The agency

shall include in the report required under s. 409.8177 an evaluation of the Kidcare dental program. This subsection expires December 31, 2001.

Section 3. Subsection (7) of section 409.904, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended, and subsections (8) and (9) are added to said section, to read:

409.904 Optional payments for eligible persons.—The agency may make payments for medical assistance and related services on behalf of the following persons who are determined to be eligible subject to the income, assets, and categorical eligibility tests set forth in federal and state law. Payment on behalf of these Medicaid eligible persons is subject to the availability of moneys and any limitations established by the General Appropriations Act or chapter 216.

- (7) A child who has not attained the age of 19 who has been determined eligible for the Medicaid program is deemed to be eligible for a total of 12 6 months, regardless of changes in circumstances other than attainment of the maximum age. Effective January 1, 1999, a child who has not attained the age of 5 and who has been determined eligible for the Medicaid program is deemed to be eligible for a total of 12 months regardless of changes in circumstances other than attainment of the maximum age.
- (8) A child who has not attained the age of 1 year, living in a family that has an income which is above 185 percent of the most recently published federal poverty level, but which is at or below 200 percent of such poverty level. In determining the eligibility of such a child, an assets test shall not be required.
- (9) A child who has not attained the age of 19 years who applies for eligibility for the Medicaid program through a

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qualified Medicaid provider must be offered the opportunity, subject to federal regulations, to be made presumptively eligible for the Medicaid program.

Section 4. Paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 624.91, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read:

- 624.91 The Florida Healthy Kids Corporation Act.--
- (4) CORPORATION AUTHORIZATION, DUTIES, POWERS.--
- (b) The Florida Healthy Kids Corporation shall phase in a program to:
- 1. Organize school children groups to facilitate the provision of comprehensive health insurance coverage to children;
- 2. Arrange for the collection of any family, local contributions, or employer payment or premium, in an amount to be determined by the board of directors, to provide for payment of premiums for comprehensive insurance coverage and for the actual or estimated administrative expenses;
- 3. Establish the administrative and accounting procedures for the operation of the corporation;
- 4. Establish, with consultation from appropriate professional organizations, standards for preventive health services and providers and comprehensive insurance benefits appropriate to children; provided that such standards for rural areas shall not limit primary care providers to board-certified pediatricians;
- 5. Establish eligibility criteria which children must meet in order to participate in the program;
- 6. Establish procedures under which applicants to and participants in the program may have grievances reviewed by an impartial body and reported to the board of directors of the 31 | corporation;

- 7. Establish participation criteria and, if appropriate, contract with an authorized insurer, health maintenance organization, or insurance administrator to provide administrative services to the corporation;
- 8. Establish enrollment criteria which shall include penalties or waiting periods of not fewer than 60 days for reinstatement of coverage upon voluntary cancellation for nonpayment of family premiums;
- 9. If a space is available, establish a special open enrollment period of 30 days' duration for any child who is enrolled in Medicaid or Medikids if such child loses Medicaid or Medikids eligibility and becomes eligible for the Florida Healthy Kids program;
- of health care services, meeting standards established by the corporation, for the provision of comprehensive insurance coverage to participants. Such standards shall include criteria under which the corporation may contract with more than one provider of health care services in program sites. Health plans shall be selected through a competitive bid process. The selection of health plans shall be based primarily on quality criteria established by the board. The health plan selection criteria and scoring system, and the scoring results, shall be available upon request for inspection after the bids have been awarded;
- 11. Develop and implement a plan to publicize the Florida Healthy Kids Corporation, the eligibility requirements of the program, and the procedures for enrollment in the program and to maintain public awareness of the corporation and the program;

- 12. Secure staff necessary to properly administer the corporation. Staff costs shall be funded from state and local matching funds and such other private or public funds as become available. The corporation shall reduce or waive local match requirements, provided funds are designated for this purpose in the General Appropriations Act. The board of directors shall determine the number of staff members necessary to administer the corporation;
- 13. As appropriate, enter into contracts with local school boards or other agencies to provide onsite information, enrollment, and other services necessary to the operation of the corporation;
- 14. Provide a report on an annual basis to the Governor, Insurance Commissioner, Commissioner of Education, Senate President, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and Minority Leaders of the Senate and the House of Representatives;
- 15. Each fiscal year, establish a maximum number of participants by county, on a statewide basis, who may enroll in the program without the benefit of local matching funds. Thereafter, the corporation may establish local matching requirements for supplemental participation in the program. The corporation may vary local matching requirements and enrollment by county depending on factors which may influence the generation of local match, including, but not limited to, population density, per capita income, existing local tax effort, and other factors. The corporation also may accept in-kind match in lieu of cash for the local match requirement to the extent allowed by Title XXI of the Social Security Act. The corporation shall reduce or waive local match

requirements, provided funds are designated for this purpose in the General Appropriations Act; and

16. Establish eligibility criteria, premium and cost-sharing requirements, and benefit packages which conform to the provisions of the Florida Kidcare program, as created in ss. 409.810-409.820.

Section 5. The Agency for Health Care Administration, in conjunction with the Department of Children and Family Services, is authorized to implement the automation of the processing of applications and determinations of eligibility for services under Title XXI of the Social Security Act.

Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.

HOUSE SUMMARY

Deletes a provision that makes Medicaid third-party liability requirements applicable to the Medikids program. Removes Medikids eligibility for children under 1 year of age. Authorizes the Agency for Health Care Administration to implement certain procedures for mandatory assignment of Medikids applicants who do not make a voluntary choice of a managed care plan or MediPass. Authorizes the agency to implement a Kidcare dental program, subject to annual appropriation, and provides requirements therefor. Provides continuous eligibility of children for Medicaid, and provides presumptive eligibility. Raises from 185 percent to 200 percent of federal poverty level the family income ceiling for Medicaid eligibility of a child under 1 year of age. Authorizes the Florida Healthy Kids Corporation to reduce or waive local match requirements for staff costs and supplemental participation in the program, if funds are designated for these purposes in the General Appropriations Act. Authorizes the agency, in conjunction with the Department of Children and Family Services, to automate processing of applications and eligibility determinations under Title XXI of the Social Security Act.
