The CS requires the Department of Community Affairs and the Department of Transportation to submit to the Legislature, on or before December 1, 1999, proposed legislative language implementing the revenue neutral recommendations of the Transportation and Land Use Study Committee.

The Transportation and Land Use Study Committee was created by the 1998 Legislature in Section 30 of the CS/SB 2472. The committee was charged with evaluating transportation and land use planning and coordination issues in Florida. Recommendations were required to include needed changes to the transportation planning requirements in chapter 163, F.S., and in other statutes as appropriate.
