(9) "Public swimming pool" means a swimming pool, as 18 defined in s. 514.011(2), which is operated, with or without 19 charge, for the use of the general public; however, the term 20 21 does not include a swimming pool located on the grounds of a 22 private residence. 24	except that no penalty shall be imposed if the person, within
25	45 days after issuance of a citation therefor, has equipped
26	the pool with at least one safety feature as required in
27	subsection (1) and has attended a drowning prevention
28	education program as required in s. 515.31. However, the

30	program is waived if such program is not offered within 45

515.29 Residential swimming pool barrier 1 2 requirements.--3 (1) A residential swimming pool barrier must have all 4 of the following characteristics: 5 The barrier must be at least 4 feet high on the (a) 6 outside. 7 (b) The barrier may not have any gaps, openings, 8 indentations, protrusions, or structural components that could allow a young child to crawl under, squeeze through, or climb 9 10 over the barrier. 11 (c) The barrier must be placed around the perimeter of 12 the pool and must be separate from any fence, wall, or other 13 enclosure surrounding the yard unless the fence, wall, or other enclosure or portion thereof is situated on the 14 15 perimeter of the pool, is being used as part of the barrier, 16 and meets the barrier requirements of this section. 17 (d) The barrier must be placed sufficiently away from 18 the water's edge to prevent a young child or medically frail elderly person who may have managed to penetrate the barrier 19 from immediately falling into the water. 20 21 (2) The structure of an aboveground swimming pool may be used as its barrier or the barrier for such a pool may be 22 mounted on top of its structure; however, such structure or 23 24 separately mounted barrier must meet all barrier requirements of this section. equipped with a self-latching locking device, the release 1 2 mechanism of which must be located on the pool side of the 3 gate and so placed that it cannot be reached by a young child 4 over the top or through any opening or gap. 5 (4) A wall of a dwelling may serve as part of the 6 barrier if it does not contain any door or window that opens 7 to provide access to the swimming pool. (5) A barrier may not be located in a way that allows 8 any permanent structure, equipment, or similar object to be 9 10 used for climbing the barrier. 11 515.31 Drowning prevention education program; public 12 information publication. --(1) The department shall develop a drowning prevention 13 education program, which shall be made available to the public 14 15 at the state and local levels and which shall be required as set forth in s. 515.27(2) for persons in violation of the pool 16 17 safety requirements of this chapter. The department may charge 18 a fee, not to exceed \$100, for attendance at such a program. The drowning prevention education program shall be funded 19 using fee proceeds, state funds appropriated for such purpose, 20 21 and grants. (2) The department shall also produce, for 22 distribution to the public at no charge, a publication that 23 24 provides information on drowning prevention and the responsibilities of pool ownership. 25 26 515.33 Information required to be furnished to 27 buyers.--A licensed pool contractor, on entering into an 28 agreement with a buyer to build a residential swimming pool, 29 or a licensed home builder or developer, on entering into an 30 agreement with a buyer to build a house that includes a residential swimming pool, must give the buyer a document 31 6

containing the requirements of this chapter and a copy of the 1 2 publication produced by the department under s. 515.31 that 3 provides information on drowning prevention and the 4 responsibilities of pool ownership. 5 515.35 Rulemaking authority.--The department shall 6 adopt rules pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act 7 establishing the fees required to attend drowning prevention education programs and setting forth the information required 8 under this chapter to be provided by licensed pool contractors 9 10 and licensed home builders or developers. 515.37 Exemptions.--This chapter does not apply to: 11 12 (1) Any system of sumps, irrigation canals, or irrigation flood control or drainage works constructed or 13 14 operated for the purpose of storing, delivering, distributing, 15 or conveying water. (2) Stock ponds, storage tanks, livestock operations, 16 17 livestock watering troughs, or other structures used in normal 18 agricultural practices. 19 (3) Public swimming pools. 20 (4) Any political subdivision that has adopted or 21 adopts a residential pool safety ordinance, provided the ordinance is equal to or more stringent than the provisions of 22 23 this chapter. 24 (5) Any portable spa with a safety cover that complies 25 with ASTM F1346-91(Standard Performance Specification for 26 Safety Covers and Labeling Requirements for All Covers for 27 Swimming Pools, Spas and Hot Tubs).
