13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

15	Section 1. Section 381.100, Florida Statutes, is
16	created to read:
17	381.100 Short titleSections 381.100-381.103 may be
18	cited as the "Florida Community Health Protection Act."
19	Section 2. Section 381.102, Florida Statutes, is
20	created to read:
21	381.102 Community Health pilot projects
22	(1) The Legislature has determined that:
23	(a) The state is committed to the economic,
24	environmental, and public health revitalization of its
25	communities;
26	(b) Measures to address the public health needs of
27	low-income communities in urban and rural areas must be
28	implemented in order to ensure the sustainability of these
29	communities;
30	(c) The implementation of these measures will enhance
31	cooperative efforts among the private sector, government, and

 nonprofit organizations in this state to ensure the
sustainability of Florida; and

- (d) It would be beneficial to provide resources in this state to undertake a series of pilot projects that demonstrate techniques and approaches to ensure health care for disease prevention and health promotion for low-income persons who are living in urban and rural communities.
- (2) Community Health pilot projects are hereby established to promote disease prevention and health promotion among low-income persons living in urban and rural communities.
- (3) The pilot projects may form partnerships with existing health care providers and units, contribute to a health care needs assessment, provide research capacity to improve health status, and serve as the basis for health care capacity in urban and rural communities.
  - (4) The following pilot projects are created:
- (a) In Pinellas County, for the Greenwood Community Health Center in Clearwater.
- (b) In Escambia County, for the low-income communities within the Palafox Redevelopment Area.
- (c) In Hillsborough, Pasco, Pinellas, and Manatee counties for the Urban League of Pinellas County, to operate its mobile health screening unit to provide public health care to persons living in low-income urban and rural communities.
- (d) In Palm Beach County, for the low-income communities within the City of Riviera Beach.
- (e) In the City of St. Petersburg, for the low-income communities within the Challenge 2001 Area.
- Section 3. Section 381.103, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

381.103 Community Health Pilot Projects; duties of department.--The department shall:

- (1) Assist the pilot projects in development and implementation of their community programs by acting as the granting agency and contracting with the pilot projects.
- (2) Facilitate the integration of the pilot projects with ongoing departmental programs, so that duplication of services is avoided and synergy between the programs enhanced.
- (3) Develop educational and outreach programs for health care providers and communities that increase awareness of health care needs for low-income persons living in urban and rural communities.
- (4) Assist the pilot projects in obtaining low-cost health care services designed to prevent disease and promote health in low-income communities.
- (5) Prepare a report to be submitted to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Governor on the findings, accomplishments, and recommendations of the Community Health pilot projects by or on January 1, 2001.
- (6) Facilitate cooperation between affected communities, appropriate agencies, and ongoing initiatives, such as Front Porch Florida.

Section 4. (1) There is hereby appropriated to the

Department of Health from the General Revenue Fund to the

Health Services Administrative Trust Fund in the Department of

Health the sum of \$1.825 million for fiscal year 1999-2000 for

the Community Health pilot projects. Of this amount: \$380,000

each to the Greenwood Community Health Center in Clearwater,

Pinellas County, Palafox Redevelopment Area in Escambia

County, the Challenge 2001 Area in the City of St. Petersburg,

 and the City of Riviera Beach in Palm Beach County; \$100,000 to the Urban League of Pinellas County; and \$205,000 to the Department of Health, to assist in the implementation of the pilot projects.

- (a) Funding for the pilot projects which shall be used for delivery of health services, including screening, diagnosis of disease, treatment or routing for treatment of disease; preventive annual physical examinations; and consultation on measures to prevent diseases; construction costs associated with the delivery of health services; or operation costs associated with the delivery of health services;
- (b) Funding for the Department of Health which shall be used for:
- 1. Identification of health needs for low-income persons living in urban and rural communities.
- 2. Resources for accessing the delivery of health services through Medicare, Medicaid, and third-party coverage, among other sources, and for ensuring quality assurance and quality control for the implementation of the Community Health pilot projects.
- 3. Preparing a report to be submitted to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Governor on the findings, accomplishments, and recommendations of the Community Health pilot projects as provided in section 381.103(5), Florida Statutes.
- $\underline{\text{4.}}$  To administer the responsibilities in accordance with s. 381.103.
  - Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.

STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 2352 Replaces references to "environmentally contaminated sites" with references to "urban and rural areas;" deletes references to "brownfields" and the federal Superfund program; creates a pilot project in the City of St. Petersburg; specifies that the Department of Health is to submit the report it is required to prepare by January 1, 2001; revises the appropriation time frame to 1 year instead of 4 years; increases the appropriated allocation to the Department of Health from \$200,000 to \$205,000; and revises the specified uses for which the pilot project funding may be used.
