Subsection (6) is added to section 322.12, 13 Florida Statutes, to read: 14 322.12 Examination of applicants.--15 (6)(a) The department shall examine every applicant 16 17 for an original driver license, or renewal thereof, every 3 years after the attainment of the licensee's 75th birthday. 18 19 (b) Any applicant or licensee who has attained the age 20 of 73 years and 6 months, but is not older than 75 years of 21 age, may be issued a Florida driver license valid through 22 midnight of the applicant's 78th birthday. 23 (c) All examinations and reexaminations conducted by the department, pursuant to this subsection, shall include 24 25 vision, hearing, and other such tests as deemed necessary by 26 the department. 27 (d) The department is authorized to adjust the 28 expiration date of any issued license necessary to comply with 29 the provisions of this subsection. 30 Section 2. Subsections (2), (4), and (8) of section 31 322.18, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

- 322.18 Original applications, licenses, and renewals; expiration of licenses; delinquent licenses.--
- (2) Each applicant who is entitled to the issuance of a driver's license, as provided in this section, shall be issued a driver's license, as follows:
- (a) An applicant applying for an original issuance shall be issued a driver's license which expires at midnight on the licensee's birthday which next occurs on or after the sixth anniversary of the date of issue. An applicant for an original license, who is 75 years of age or older, shall be issued a license which expires at midnight on the licensee's birthday which next occurs on or after the third anniversary of the date of issue.
- (b) An applicant applying for a renewal issuance or renewal extension, whose driving record reflects assessment of no more than three points for the preceding 3 years, shall be issued a driver's license or renewal extension sticker which expires at midnight on the licensee's birthday which next occurs 6 4 years after the month of expiration of the license being renewed, except that a driver whose driving record reflects no convictions for the preceding 3 years shall be issued a driver's license or renewal extension sticker which expires at midnight on the licensee's birthday which next occurs 6 years after the month of expiration of the license being renewed.
- (4) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, all licenses shall be renewable every  $\underline{3}$   $\underline{4}$  years or 6 years, depending upon the terms of issuance and shall be issued or extended upon application, payment of the fees required by s. 322.21, and successful passage of any required examination,

unless the department has reason to believe that the licensee is no longer qualified to receive a license.

- (8) The department shall issue 4-year and 6-year license extensions by mail, electronic, or telephonic means without reexamination for no more than 2 consecutive license extensions.
- (a) If the department determines from its records that the holder of a license about to expire is eligible for renewal, the department shall mail a renewal notice to the licensee at his or her last known address, not less than 30 days prior to the licensee's birthday. The renewal notice shall direct the licensee to appear at a driver license office for in-person renewal or to transmit the completed renewal notice and the fees required by s. 322.21 to the department by mail, electronically, or telephonically within the 30 days preceding the licensee's birthday for a license extension. License extensions shall not be available to drivers directed to appear for in-person renewal.
- (b) Upon receipt of a properly completed renewal notice, payment of the required fees, and upon determining that the licensee is still eligible for renewal, the department shall send a license extension sticker to the licensee to affix to the expiring license as evidence that the license term has been extended.
- (c) The department shall issue license extensions for two consecutive license expirations only. Upon expiration of a second two consecutive license extension period periods, in-person renewal with reexamination as provided in s. 322.121 shall be required. A person who is out of this state when his or her license expires may be issued a 90-day temporary driving permit without reexamination. At the end of the 90-day

 period, the person must either return to this state or apply for a license where the person is located, except for a member of the Armed Forces as provided in s. 322.121(5)(6).

- (d) In-person renewal at a driver license office shall not be available to drivers whose records indicate they were directed to apply for a license extension.
- (e) Any person who knowingly possesses any forged, stolen, fictitious, counterfeit, or unlawfully issued license extension sticker, unless possession by such person has been duly authorized by the department, commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
- (f) The department shall develop a plan for the equitable distribution of license extensions and renewals and the orderly implementation of this section.

Section 3. Subsection (1) of section 322.21, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.21 License fees; procedure for handling and collecting fees.--

- (1) Except as otherwise provided herein, the fee for:
- (a) An original or renewal commercial driver's license is \$50, which shall include the fee for driver education provided by s. 233.063; however, if an applicant has completed training and is applying for employment or is currently employed in a public or nonpublic school system that requires the commercial license, the fee shall be the same as for a Class E driver's license. A delinquent fee of \$1 shall be added for a renewal made not more than 12 months after the license expiration date.
- 30 (b) An original Class D or Class E driver's license is 31 \$10 for a license issued for 3 years and \$20 for a license

issued for 6 years \$20, which shall include the fee for driver's education provided by s. 233.063; however, if an applicant has completed training and is applying for employment or is currently employed in a public or nonpublic school system that requires a commercial driver license, the fee shall be the same as for a Class E license.

- (c) The renewal or extension of a Class D or Class E driver's license <u>issued for 3 years is \$7.50 and the renewal</u> or extension of a Class D or Class E driver's license issued <u>for 6 years</u> or of a license restricted to motorcycle use only is \$15, except that a delinquent fee of \$1 shall be added for a renewal or extension made not more than 12 months after the license expiration date. The fee provided in this paragraph shall include the fee for driver's education provided by s. 233.063.
- (d) An original driver's license restricted to motorcycle use only is \$20, which shall include the fee for driver's education provided by s. 233.063.
  - (e) Each endorsement required by s. 322.57 is \$5. Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.

## HOUSE SUMMARY

Directs the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to examine every applicant for an original driver license, or renewal thereof, every 3 years after the attainment of the licensee's 75th birthday. Provides for a 3-year license for drivers over 75 years of age. See bill for details.
