| 18 | Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:      |

| 20 | Section 1. Present subsection (9) of section 336.025,          |
| 21 | Florida Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (10), and a new  |
| 22 | subsection (9) is added to that section to read:               |
| 23 | 336.025 County transportation system; levy of local            |

| 25 | (9) Notwithstanding any other provision of this                |
| 26 | section, the governing board of a charter county that has a    |
| 27 | population of 1,250,000 or more persons and which levied a tax |
| 28 | under paragraph (1)(b) prior to January 1, 1999, may use the   |
| 29 | proceeds of 1 cent of that tax in any fiscal year to fund any  |

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1 municipalities located within the county, representing a majority of the population of the incorporated area in such 2 3 county, which excludes the distribution of any proceeds derived from the 1-cent tax that is used for homeless 4 5 assistance programs countywide. In authorizing the use of б these proceeds for countywide homeless assistance programs, the governing board of the charter county must adopt a 7 8 resolution certifying that the charter county is meeting its transportation needs as identified in the 5-year 9 10 transportation capital improvements program included within 11 the capital improvements element of the charter county's comprehensive plan. The charter county shall file a certified 12 copy of the resolution with the executive director of the 13 14 Department of Revenue and the Secretary of Community Affairs. A county that elects to use tax proceeds for homeless 15 assistance programs pursuant to this subsection must continue 16 17 to expend county funds from other sources each year for homeless assistance programs in an amount that is at least 18 19 equal to the amount it expended for such programs in the current fiscal year in which the county makes such election. 20 The county must also have a segregated account established for 21 these gas tax funds prior to implementation under this act. 22 For purposes of this subsection, the term "homeless assistance 23 24 program" includes, but is not limited to, the construction, renovation, rehabilitation, and operation of emergency 25 shelters, homeless assistance centers, or other directly 26 27 related facilities which provide assistance within an established continuum of care to homeless persons within the 28 county. Unless otherwise extended, the authority to use these 29 proceeds for countywide homeless assistance programs as 30 31 authorized by this subsection expires on September 30, 2005.
