kindergartens; authorizing the enrollment of
certain children who are determined to be ready
for entrance into kindergarten; providing
eligibility requirements; providing school
district requirements; authorizing the
Commissioner of Education to adopt rules;
providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1) of section 232.01, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, are amended to read:

18 232.01 School attendance.--

(1)(a)1. All children who have attained the age of 6 years or who will have attained the age of 6 years by February 1 of any school year or who are older than 6 years of age but who have not attained the age of 16 years, except as hereinafter provided, are required to attend school regularly during the entire school term.

- 2.<u>a.</u> Children who will have attained the age of 5 years on or before September 1 of the school year are eligible for admission to public kindergartens during that school year under rules prescribed by the school board.
- <u>b.</u> Beginning in the 1999-2000 school year, children who will have attained the age of 5 years after September 1 but before October 1 of the school year are eligible to take

the assessment of readiness for kindergarten which is included 1 2 in the statewide assessment program. Beginning in the 2000-2001 school year, children who will have attained the age 3 of 5 years after September 1 but before November 1 of the 4 5 school year are eligible to take the assessment of readiness 6 for kindergarten which is included in the statewide assessment 7 program. Beginning in the 2001-2002 school year, children who 8 will have attained the age of 5 years after September 1 but 9 before December 1 of the school year are eligible to take the assessment of readiness for kindergarten which is included in 10 11 the statewide assessment program. Beginning in the 2002-2003 12 school year, children who will have attained the age of 5 13 years after September 1 but before January 1 of the school 14 year are eligible to take the assessment of readiness for kindergarten which is included in the statewide assessment 15 16 program. Upon written request of a child's parent or guardian, 17 the school district must provide at least one opportunity for the child to take the assessment of readiness for 18 19 kindergarten. Any child who is determined to be ready for 20 entrance into kindergarten, according to rules of the Commissioner of Education, is eligible for admission to public 21 kindergartens during that school year. Any child who is 22 determined not to be ready for entrance into kindergarten, 23 according to rules of the commissioner, is subject to the 24 admission requirements of sub-subparagraph a. The commissioner 25 may adopt rules to implement the provisions of this 26 27 sub-subparagraph. 28 3. Children who will have attained the age of 3 years

on or before September 1 of the school year are eligible for

admission to prekindergarten early intervention programs

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30 31 during that school year as provided in s. 230.2305 or a preschool program as provided in s. 228.061.

(b) Any child who has attained the age of 6 years on or before September 1 of the school year and who has been enrolled in a public school or who has attained the age of 6 years on or before September 1 and has satisfactorily completed the requirements for kindergarten in a nonpublic school from which the district school board accepts transfer of academic credit, or who has been enrolled in a public kindergarten under the provisions of sub-subparagraph (a)2.b., or who otherwise meets the criteria for admission or transfer in a manner similar to that applicable to other grades, shall progress according to the district's pupil progression plan. However, nothing in this section shall authorize the state or any school district to oversee or exercise control over the curricula or academic programs of nonpublic schools or home education programs.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.
