22	or pedorthics, may be licensed as a prosthetist, orthotist,
23	prosthetist-orthotist, orthotic fitter, orthotic fitter
24	assistant, or pedorthist, as determined from the person's

27	of the application fee and licensing fee and after the board

The period of experience required for licensure under this subsection is 5 years for a prosthetist; 2 years for an orthotic fitter, an orthotic fitter assistant, or a pedorthist; and 5 years for an orthotist whose scope of practice is defined under s. 468.80(7). Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. HOUSE SUMMARY Extends the deadline for a person who has practiced orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics for the required period to apply for licensure, based on the person's experience and educational preparation, without meeting the educational requirements set forth in statute.
