appropriate grade levels in areas including, but not limited to, the following: (1) Character development, ethics, and law education. Each school board shall be encouraged to install in the elementary schools of the district a program in character б development which is the same as or similar to the Character Counts or Character First! Education Series. The programs must be secular in nature and stress such character qualities as attentiveness, patience, and initiative. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. 

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
