This bill amends and recreates 215.551, Florida Statutes

The National Forest Trust fund is one of three funds used for the deposit and disbursement of federal funds. In 1995, when the Department of Banking and Finance attempted to reduce the number of trust funds, the National Forest Trust Fund was inadvertently omitted. The Federal Use of State Lands Trust Fund serves as a clearing fund for the distribution of funds apportioned to the counties.
