This legislation re-creates the Clerk of the Court Child Support Enforcement Collection Trust Fund within the Department of Revenue.

This bill re-creates section 61.1811, Florida Statutes.

The Clerk of the Court Child Support Enforcement Collection Trust Fund is used to control and account for fees imposed on Child Support payments. The trust fund preserves the integrity of Child Support payment fees to be used for the development, implementation and operations of an automated collections system.
