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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section 233.061, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, is amended to read:

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233.061 Required instruction.--

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schools, subject to the rules and regulations of the commissioner, the state board, and the school board, shall teach efficiently and faithfully, using the books and materials required, following the prescribed courses of study,

(2) Members of the instructional staff of the public

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and employing approved methods of instruction, the following:

history of African <u>culture prior to the European</u>

<u>implementation peoples before the political conflicts that led</u>

to the development of slavery, the passage to America, <u>the</u>

dehumanizing effects of the enslavement experience, abolition,
and the <u>unique</u> contributions of African Americans to society.

Curriculum relating to the history of African Americans must
be designed to lead to an investigation of human behavior, the

negative consequences resulting from racial hatred, encourage
tolerance of different races and cultures, and to promote
racial equity and pride.

Section 2. Paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 233.09, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

233.09 Duties of each state instructional materials committee.—The duties of each state instructional materials committee shall be:

- (4) EVALUATION OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS.--To evaluate carefully all instructional materials submitted, to ascertain which instructional materials, if any, submitted for consideration best implement the selection criteria developed by the Commissioner of Education and those curricular objectives included within applicable performance standards provided for in s. 229.565.
- (d) When recommending instructional materials for use in the schools, each committee shall require, when appropriate to the comprehension of pupils, that materials for social science, history, or civics classes contain the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States.

 Effective July 1, 2002 and thereafter, instructional materials
- 30 recommended for adoption for subjects including, but not
- limited to, science, math, history, and health must include

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historical data related to the contributions of African Americans, Hispanics, and women. No instructional materials shall be recommended by any committee for use in the schools which contain any matter reflecting unfairly upon persons because of their race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry, gender, or occupation.

Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 233.34, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

233.34 Use of instructional materials allocation; instructional materials, library books, and reference books; repair of books.--

(2) Each school district shall use the annual allocation for the purchase of instructional materials included on the state-adopted list. No less than 50 percent of the annual allocation shall be used to purchase items which will be used to provide instruction to students at the level or levels for which the materials are designed. However, up to 50 percent of the annual allocation may be used for the purchase of instructional materials, including library and reference books and nonprint materials, not included on the state-adopted list and for the repair and renovation of textbooks and library books. However, such funds may not be used for the purchase of instructional materials for subjects including, but not limited to, science, math, history, and health which do not include historical data related to the contributions of African Americans, Hispanics, and women. Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, school districts may use 100 percent of that portion of the annual allocation which is designated by the district for the purchase of instructional materials for kindergarten, and 75 31 percent of that portion of the annual allocation which is

designated for the purchase of instructional materials for first grade, to purchase materials not on the state-adopted list. Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999.
