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HOUSE AMENDMENT

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The annual use fees shall be distributed annually 1 (b) 2 to each county in the ratio that the annual use fees collected 3 by each county bears to the total fees collected for the 4 plates within the state. Each county shall distribute the funds to nongovernmental, not-for-profit agencies within the 5 county, which agencies' services provide counseling and 6 7 meeting the physical needs of pregnant women who are committed to placing their children for adoption. Funds may be 8 distributed to any certified agency that is involved or 9 10 associated with promoting adoption or foster care. 1. Agencies that receive the funds must use at least 11 12 70 percent of the funds to provide for the material needs of 13 pregnant women who are committed to placing their children for adoption, including clothing, housing, medical care, food, 14 15 utilities, and transportation. Such funds may also be expended on infants awaiting placement with adoptive parents. 16 17 2. The remaining funds may be used for adoption, 18 counseling, training, or advertising, but may not be used for administrative expenses, legal expenses, or capital 19 20 expenditures. 3. Each agency that receives such funds must submit an 21 annual audit, prepared by a certified public accountant, to 22 the county. The county may conduct a consolidated audit in 23 24 lieu of the annual audit. The Office of Program Policy 25 Analysis and Government Accountability shall review the expenditure of funds every 3 years to ensure that funds are 26 27 expended in accordance with this subsection. Any unused funds that exceed 10 percent of the funds received by an agency 28 29 during its fiscal year must be returned to the county, which 30 shall distribute them to other qualified agencies. 31 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1999. 2
