This legislation re-creates the Displaced Homemaker Trust Fund within the Department of Education.

This bill re-creates sections 28.101, 446.50 and 741.02 Florida Statutes.

The Displaced Homemaker Trust Fund was established to receive funds generated from an additional fee on marriage license applications and dissolution of marriage filings as specified in s. 28.101, F.S., and s. 741.01(3), F.S., and may receive funds from any other public or private source. These funds are to carry out the provisions of s. 446.50, F.S.
