Each enactment shall specify the types 21 22 of counties authorized to levy; the rate or rates which may be imposed; the maximum length of time the surtax may be imposed, 23 if any; the procedure which must be followed to secure voter 24 25 approval, if required; the purpose for which the proceeds may 26 be expended; and such other requirements as the Legislature 27 may provide. procedures shall be as provided in s. 212.054.

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(a) The governing body of any county may levy a 1 2 discretionary sales surtax pursuant to this subsection.
