movement within travel lanes, sudden stoppage or slowdown of 1 2 traffic, rapid lane changing and other dangerous traffic 3 movement, increased vehicular accidents, and motorist injuries and fatalities. Such prohibited uses include, but are not 4 5 limited to, the free distribution or sale, or display or solicitation for free distribution or sale, of any 6 7 merchandise, goods, property or services; the solicitation for 8 charitable purposes; the servicing or repairing of any 9 vehicle, except the rendering of emergency service; the storage of vehicles being serviced or repaired on abutting 10 11 property or elsewhere; and the display of advertising of any sort, except that any portion of a state transportation 12 13 facility may be used for an art festival, parade, fair, or other special event if permitted by the appropriate local 14 governmental entity.
