(1) A person who knows that a crime which exposes the victim to bodily injury is being committed must report the crime to a law enforcement officer as soon as it is reasonably practicable, to the extent that report can be made without danger to the person reporting or to another person. Any person who violates this subsection commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(2) This section may not be construed to apply to a person either who is prosecuted as a principal in the first degree or an accessory after the fact to an offense, or who is prosecuted for attempting, soliciting, or conspiring to commit an offense, when the prosecuted offense has occurred in the

course of the same criminal conduct, transaction, or episode as the criminal offense which exposes the victim to bodily injury. Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1999.
