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14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 252.355,
17	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
18	252.355 Registry of disabled persons <u>with special</u>
19	needs; notice
20	(1) In order to meet the special needs of persons who
21	would need assistance during evacuations and sheltering
22	because of physical <u>, mental, or sensory disabilities</u> or mental
23	handicaps, each local emergency management agency in the state
24	shall maintain a registry of disabled persons <u>with special</u>
25	<u>needs</u> located within the jurisdiction of the local agency.
26	The registration shall identify those persons in need of
27	assistance and plan for resource allocation to meet those
28	identified needs. To assist the local emergency management
29	agency in identifying such persons, the Department of Children
30	and Family Services, Department of Health, Department of Labor
31	and Employment Security, and Department of Elderly Affairs
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Health and Rehabilitative Services shall provide registration 1 2 information to all of their its special needs clients and to 3 all incoming clients as a part of the intake process. The registry shall be updated annually. The registration program 4 5 shall give disabled persons with special needs the option of preauthorizing emergency response personnel to enter their 6 7 homes during search and rescue operations if necessary to 8 assure their safety and welfare following disasters. 9 (3) All records, data, information, correspondence, and communications relating to the registration of disabled 10 11 persons with special needs as provided in subsection (1) are 12 confidential and exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1), 13 except that such information shall be available to other 14 emergency response agencies, as determined by the local emergency management director. 15 16 Section 2. Section 381.0303, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 17 18 381.0303 Health practitioner recruitment for special 19 needs shelters.--20 (1) PURPOSE. -- The purpose of this section is to designate the Department of Health, through its county health 21 22 departments, as the lead agency for coordination of the recruitment of health care practitioners to staff special 23 needs shelters in times of emergency or disaster and to 24 25 provide resources to the department to carry out this 26 responsibility. However, nothing in this section prohibits a 27 county health department from entering into an agreement with 28 a local emergency management agency to assume the lead responsibility for recruiting health care practitioners. 29 (2) SPECIAL NEEDS SHELTER PLAN AND STAFFING. -- Provided 30 funds have been appropriated to support medical services 31

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disaster coordinator positions in county health departments, 1 2 the department shall assume lead responsibility for the local coordination of local medical and health care providers, the 3 American Red Cross, and other interested parties in developing 4 5 a plan for the staffing and medical management of special б needs shelters. The plan shall be in conformance with the 7 local comprehensive emergency management plan. 8 (a) County health departments shall, in conjunction 9 with the local emergency management agencies, have the lead responsibility for coordination of the recruitment of health 10 11 care practitioners to staff local special needs shelters. 12 County health departments shall have the option of assigning 13 their employees to work in special needs shelters. 14 (b) The appropriate county health department and local 15 emergency management agency shall jointly determine who has 16 responsibility for medical supervision in a special needs 17 shelter. (c) Local emergency management agencies shall be 18 19 responsible for the designation and operation of special needs 20 shelters during times of emergency or disaster. County health departments shall assist the local emergency management agency 21 22 with regard to the management of medical services in special 23 needs shelters. 24 (3) REIMBURSEMENT TO HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONERS.--The Department of Health shall reimburse, subject to the 25 26 availability of funds for this purpose, health care practitioners as defined in s. 455.501, provided the 27 28 practitioner is not providing care to a patient under an existing contract, and emergency medical technicians and 29 paramedics licensed pursuant to chapter 401 for medical care 30 provided at the request of the department in special needs 31

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shelters or at other locations during times of emergency or 1 2 major disaster. Reimbursement for health care practitioners, except for physicians, shall be based on the average hourly 3 rate that such practitioners were paid according to the most 4 5 recent survey of Florida hospitals conducted by the Florida б Hospital Association. Reimbursement shall be requested on 7 forms prepared by the Department of Health. If a Presidential 8 Disaster Declaration has been made, and the Federal Government 9 makes funds available, the department shall use such funds for reimbursement of eligible expenditures. In other situations, 10 11 or if federal funds do not fully compensate the department for 12 reimbursement made pursuant to this section, the department 13 shall submit to the Cabinet or Legislature, as appropriate, a 14 budget amendment requesting reimbursement. 15 (4) HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER REGISTRY.--The department 16 may use the registries established in ss. 401.273 and 455.276 17 when health care practitioners are needed to staff special needs shelters or to staff disaster medical assistance teams. 18 19 SPECIAL NEEDS SHELTER INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE.--The (5) 20 Department of Health may establish a special needs shelter interagency committee, to be chaired and staffed by the 21 22 department. The committee shall resolve problems related to special needs shelters not addressed in the state 23 comprehensive emergency medical plan and shall serve as an 24 25 oversight committee to monitor the planning and operation of 26 special needs shelters. 27 (a) The committee may: 28 1. On or before January 1, 2000, resolve questions 29 concerning the roles and responsibilities of state agencies and other organizations that are necessary to implement the 30 31 program.

1 2. On or before January 1, 2000, identify any issues 2 requiring additional legislation and funding. 3 3. Develop and negotiate any necessary interagency 4 agreements. 5 4. Undertake other such activities as the department б deems necessary to facilitate the implementation of this 7 section. 8 5. Submit recommendations to the Legislature as 9 necessary. 10 (b) The special needs shelter interagency committee shall be composed of representatives of emergency management, 11 12 health, medical, and social services organizations. Membership 13 shall include, but shall not be limited to, the Departments of 14 Community Affairs, Children and Family Services, Elderly 15 Affairs, Labor and Employment Security, and Education; the Agency for Health Care Administration; the Florida Medical 16 Association; Associated Home Health Industries of Florida, 17 Inc.; the Florida Nurses Association; the Florida Health Care 18 19 Association; the Florida Hospital Association; the Florida 20 Statutory Teaching Hospital Council; the Florida Association of Homes for the Aging; the Florida Emergency Preparedness 21 22 Association; the American Red Cross; Florida Hospices, Inc.; 23 the Association of Community Hospitals and Health Systems; the 24 Florida Association of Health Maintenance Organizations; the 25 Florida League of Health Systems; and the Salvation Army. 26 (c) Meetings of the committee shall be held in 27 Tallahassee and members of the committee shall serve at the 28 expense of the agencies or organizations they represent. 29 (6) RULES.--The department may adopt rules necessary to implement this section. 30 31

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1 Section 3. Section 400.492, Florida Statutes, is 2 created to read: 3 400.492 Provision of services during an 4 emergency. -- Each home health agency shall prepare and maintain 5 a comprehensive emergency management plan that is consistent 6 with the standards adopted by national accreditation 7 organizations and consistent with the local special needs 8 plan. The plan shall be updated annually and shall provide for continuing home health services during an emergency that 9 interrupts patient care or services in the patient's home. The 10 11 plan shall describe how the home health agency establishes and 12 maintains an effective response to emergencies and disasters, 13 including: notifying staff when emergency response measures 14 are initiated; providing for communication between staff 15 members, county health departments, and local emergency 16 management agencies, including a backup system; identifying 17 resources necessary to continue essential care or services or referrals to other organizations subject to written agreement; 18 19 and prioritizing and contacting patients who need continued 20 care or services. (1) Each patient record for patients who are listed in 21 22 the registry established pursuant to s. 252.355 shall include a description of how care or services will be continued in the 23 24 event of an emergency or disaster. The home health agency 25 shall discuss the emergency provisions with the patient and 26 the patient's caregivers, including where and how the patient 27 is to evacuate, procedures for notifying the home health 28 agency in the event that the patient evacuates to a location 29 other than the shelter identified in the patient record, and a list of medications and equipment which must either accompany 30 31

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1 the patient or will be needed by the patient in the event of 2 an evacuation. 3 (2) Each home health agency shall maintain a current prioritized list of patients who need continued services 4 5 during an emergency. The list shall indicate how services б shall be continued in the event of an emergency or disaster 7 for each patient and if the patient is to be transported to a 8 special needs shelter, and shall indicate if the patient is 9 receiving skilled nursing services and the patient's medication and equipment needs. The list shall be furnished to 10 11 county health departments and to local emergency management 12 agencies, upon request. 13 (3) Home health agencies shall not be required to 14 continue to provide care to patients in emergency situations that are beyond their control and that make it impossible to 15 16 provide services, such as when roads are impassable or when 17 patients do not go to the location specified in their patient 18 records. (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 400.464(2) or 19 20 any other provision of law to the contrary, a home health agency may provide services in a special needs shelter located 21 22 in any county. Section 4. Subsection (1) of section 400.497, Florida 23 Statutes, is amended, and subsection (11) is added to said 24 25 section, to read: 26 400.497 Rules establishing minimum standards.--The 27 Agency for Health Care Administration shall adopt, publish, 28 and enforce rules to implement this part, including, as 29 applicable, ss. 400.506 and 400.509, which must provide reasonable and fair minimum standards relating to: 30 31

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(1) Scope of home health services to be provided, 1 2 which shall include services to be provided during emergency evacuation and sheltering. 3 4 (11) Preparation of a comprehensive emergency 5 management plan pursuant to s. 400.492. 6 (a) The Agency for Health Care Administration shall 7 adopt rules establishing minimum criteria for the plan and 8 plan updates, with the concurrence of the Department of Health 9 and in consultation with the Department of Community Affairs. 10 (b) The rules must address the requirements in s. 400.487(7). In addition, the rules shall provide for the 11 12 maintenance of patient-specific medication lists that can 13 accompany patients who are transported from their homes. 14 (c) The plan is subject to review and approval by the 15 county health department. During its review, the county health 16 department shall ensure that the following agencies, at a 17 minimum, are given the opportunity to review the plan: 1. The local emergency management agency. 18 2. The Agency for Health Care Administration. 19 20 3. The local chapter of the American Red Cross or 21 other lead sheltering agency. 22 The district office of the Department of Children 4. 23 and Family Services. 24 25 The county health department shall complete its review within 26 60 days after receipt of the plan and shall either approve the 27 plan or advise the home health agency of necessary revisions. 28 Section 5. Subsections (15), (16), and (17) of section 29 400.506, Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, are renumbered as subsections (17), (18), and (19), respectively, and new 30 31 subsections (15) and (16) are added to said section to read: 9

1 400.506 Licensure of nurse registries; requirements; penalties.--2 3 (15) Nurse registries shall assist at-risk clients 4 with special needs registration with the appropriate local 5 emergency management agency pursuant to s. 252.355. 6 (16) Each nurse registry shall prepare and maintain a 7 comprehensive emergency management plan that is consistent 8 with national standards adopted by accreditation organizations 9 and consistent with local special needs plans. The plan shall be updated annually and provide for continuing nursing 10 11 services during an emergency that interrupts patient care or 12 services in the patient's home. Continuing services are to be 13 delivered by the nurse registry or by other health care 14 providers pursuant to a written agreement for such care. The 15 plan shall describe how the nurse registry establishes and 16 maintains an effective response to emergencies and disasters, including: notifying staff members, county health departments, 17 and local emergency management agencies, including a backup 18 19 system; identifying resources necessary to continue essential 20 care or services or referrals to other organizations subject to a written agreement; and prioritizing and contacting 21 22 patients who need continued care or services. The plan shall 23 include identifying special needs shelters and shall contain 24 provisions for ensuring continuing care to nurse registry 25 patients who go to special needs shelters. 26 (a) Each patient record for patients who are listed on the registry established pursuant to s. 252.355 shall include 27 28 a description of how care or services will be continued in the event of an emergency or disaster. The nurse registry shall 29 discuss the emergency provisions with the patient and the 30 patient's caregivers, including where and how the patient is 31

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to evacuate, procedures for notifying the nurse registry in 1 2 the event that the patient evacuates to a location other than 3 the shelter identified in the patient record, and a list of medications and equipment which must either accompany the 4 5 patient or will be needed by the patient in the event of an 6 evacuation. 7 (b) Each nurse registry shall maintain a current 8 prioritized list of patients who need continued services 9 during an emergency. The list shall indicate how services shall be continued in the event of an emergency or disaster 10 11 for each patient and if the patient is to be transported to a 12 special needs shelter, and shall indicate if the patient is 13 receiving skilled nursing services and the patient's 14 medication and equipment needs. The list shall be furnished to 15 county health departments and to local emergency management 16 agencies, upon request. (c) Nurse registries shall not be required to continue 17 to provide care to patients in emergency situations that are 18 19 beyond their control and that make it impossible to provide 20 services, such as when roads are impassable or when patients do not go to the location specified in their patient records. 21 22 Section 6. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 23 400.610, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 24 400.610 Administration and management of a hospice .--25 (1) A hospice shall have a clearly defined organized 26 governing body, consisting of a minimum of seven persons who 27 are representative of the general population of the community 28 served. The governing body shall have autonomous authority and 29 responsibility for the operation of the hospice and shall meet 30 at least quarterly. The governing body shall: 31

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1	(b) Prepare and maintain a comprehensive emergency
2	management plan that provides for continuing hospice services
3	in the event of an emergency that is consistent with local
4	special needs plans. The plan shall include provisions for
5	ensuring continuing care to hospice patients who go to special
6	needs shelters. The plan is subject to review and approval by
7	the county health department. During its review, the county
8	health department shall ensure that the department, the
9	agency, and the local chapter of the American Red Cross or
10	other lead sheltering agency have an opportunity to review and
11	comment on the plan. The county health department shall
12	complete its review within 60 days after receipt of the plan
13	and shall either approve the plan or advise the hospice of
14	necessary revisions. Prepare a disaster preparedness plan.
15	Section 7. Section 401.273, Florida Statutes, is
16	created to read:
17	401.273 Emergency medical technician and paramedic
18	registry for disasters and emergenciesThe department shall
19	include on its forms for the certification or recertification
20	of emergency medical technicians and paramedics who could
21	assist the department in the event of a disaster a question
22	asking if the practitioner would be available to provide
23	health care services in special needs shelters or to help
24	staff disaster medical assistance teams during times of
25	emergency or major disaster. The names of the emergency
26	medical technicians and paramedics who answer affirmatively
27	shall be maintained by the department as a registry for
28	disasters and emergencies.
29	Section 8. Subsection (12) is added to section 408.15,
30	Florida Statutes, 1998 Supplement, to read:

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408.15 Powers of the agency.--In addition to the 1 2 powers granted to the agency elsewhere in this chapter, the 3 agency is authorized to: 4 (12) Establish, in coordination with the Department of 5 Health, uniform standards of care to be provided in special б needs units or shelters during times of emergency or major 7 disaster. 8 Section 9. Section 455.276, Florida Statutes, is 9 created to read: 10 455.276 Health care practitioner registry for disasters and emergencies. -- The Department of Health shall 11 12 include on its forms for the licensure or certification of 13 physicians, physician assistants, certified nursing assistants, licensed practical nurses, registered nurses, 14 15 nurse practitioners, respiratory therapists, and other health 16 care practitioners who could assist the department in the event of a disaster a question asking if the practitioner 17 would be available to provide health care services in special 18 19 needs shelters or to help staff disaster medical assistance 20 teams during times of emergency or major disaster. The names of practitioners who answer affirmatively shall be maintained 21 22 by the department as a health care practitioner registry for 23 disasters and emergencies. 24 Section 10. State agencies that contract with providers for the care of persons with disabilities or 25 26 limitations that make such persons dependent upon the care of 27 others shall include emergency and disaster planning 28 provisions in such contracts at the time the contracts are initiated or upon renewal. These provisions shall include, but 29 shall not be limited to: 30 31

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1 The designation of an emergency coordinating (1) 2 officer. 3 (2) A procedure to contact all at-risk provider 4 clients, on a priority basis, prior to and immediately 5 following an emergency or disaster. 6 (3) A procedure to help at-risk clients register with 7 the special needs registry of the local emergency management 8 agency. 9 (4) A procedure to dispatch the emergency coordinating officer or other staff members to special needs shelters to 10 11 assist clients with special needs, if necessary. 12 (5) A procedure for providing the essential services 13 the organization currently provides to special needs clients 14 in preparation for, and during and following, a disaster. 15 Section 11. There is hereby appropriated from the 16 General Revenue Fund, to fund the implementation of this act: (1) To the Department of Health the sum of \$3,798,932 17 and 2 full-time-equivalent positions. 18 19 To the Department of Children and Family Services (2) 20 the sum of \$58,898 and 1 full-time-equivalent position. (3) To the Department of Elderly Affairs the sum of 21 22 \$58,898 and 1 full-time-equivalent position. 23 (4) To the Agency for Health Care Administration the 24 sum of \$58,898 and 1 full-time-equivalent position. 25 (5) To the Department of Community Affairs the sum of 26 \$58,898 and 1 full-time-equivalent position. 27 Section 12. 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4	Revises provisions relating to registration of persons requiring special needs assistance during an emergency or
5	disaster. Provides for recruitment of health care practitioners to staff special needs shelters during
6	emergencies or disasters, through the county health departments and the practitioner licensure process.
7	Authorizes the Department of Health to maintain practitioner registries and provide certain compensation
8	for care provided at special needs shelters. Provides for establishment of a special needs shelter interagency
9	committee.
10	Specifies minimum requirements for home health agency and
11	hospice comprehensive emergency management plans, and provides for plan review and approval. Requires nurse registries to assist at-risk clients with special needs
12	registration and to prepare a comprehensive emergency
13	mañagement plan. Providês for annual update of such plans.
14	Authorized the Agency for Health Care Administration to
15	Authorizes the Agency for Health Care Administration to establish uniform standards of care for special needs shelters. Requires emergency and disaster planning
16	provisions in certain state agency contracts, and specifies minimum requirements. Provides appropriations
