I. Summary:

This bill creates the Florida Commission on Federal and State Agricultural Relations (commission) within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. It provides for the commission's membership and directs the members to coordinate efforts to maximize federal funding for Florida agricultural purposes. The bill requires the Commissioner of Agriculture to submit an annual report on the actions of the commission.

II. Present Situation:

The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (department) currently employs a Federal/State Relations Director to monitor opportunities for federal grant support for agriculture and economic development in the state and to prepare grant requests as directed to gain access to federal funding. In fiscal year 1997-98, the department received \$11,397,650.36 in federal moneys to fund numerous programs, studies, and disaster relief.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 1. Creates the Florida Commission on Federal and State Agricultural Relations (commission) within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Provides that the commission be composed of the following sixteen members:

- Two members of the Florida Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;
- Three members of the Florida House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- Eight residents of the state who are engaged in the agriculture business. The President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Governor, and the Commissioner of Agriculture shall each appoint two of the residents;
- Two members of the United States Congress requested to serve by the Commissioner of Agriculture; and
- The state executive director of the Farm Services Agency of the United States Department of Agriculture requested to serve by the Commissioner of Agriculture.
- The Commissioner of Agriculture shall serve as chair of the commission.

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Provides that the members representing agricultural business interests be appointed to 4-year terms. Provides for members to be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses and to receive no further compensation. Limits the funds provided for such expenses to a maximum of \$10,000 per year for the commission. Directs the members to coordinate efforts to maximize federal funding for Florida agricultural purposes. Requires the Commissioner of Agriculture to report annually to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives on the actions of the commission.

Section 2. Provides that this act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
