A bill to be entitled
An act relating to the offense of assuming the
identity of another person; providing that it
is a third-degree felony to knowingly assume
the name, birth date, or social security number
of another person for an unlawful purpose or
for the purpose of causing a loss; providing an
effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Assuming the identity of another person
prohibited; penalty.--Any person who knowingly assumes the
name, birth date, or social security number of another person
without that person's consent and with the intent to obtain or
use the name, birth date, or social security number for an
unlawful purpose, or to cause loss to a person, commits a
felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in section
775.082, section 775.083, or section 775.084, Florida
Statutes.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1999.

SENATE SUMMARY

Provides that it is a third-degree felony for a person to
knowingly assume the name, birth date, or social security
number of another person without that person's consent
and with the intent to unlawfully use the name, birth
date, or social security number or to cause a loss to a
person.
